AN ORDINANCE.
OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO.

THE following granting of franchises to Gasmen, Electric, and other services, and also for the purpose of establishing a municipal water and electric service in Lake City is authorized by the City Council of Lake City, Utah:

SECTION 1

That permission and authority be and same be granted to Gasmen, Electric, and other services, and also for the purpose of establishing a municipal water and electric service in Lake City, Utah:

It being the intent and meaning of this ordinance that wires and other appliances erected and franchises granted and paved districts shall be to poles belonging to corporations existing within the city.

With—A written acceptance of this franchise by the grantee, and that to all the common persons interested, must be filed with the recorder within twenty (20) days of the date of the approval herein by the Mayor and a failure at any time to comply with all these and conditions of this ordinance shall constitute a forfeiture of the franchise.

SECTION 11.
This ordinance shall take effect from and after its approval by the City Council of said City, State of Utah, December 7th, 1911, and be published and referred to the Mayor for approval.
