Change of Judge and Times of
 Holding Court.

PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

UTAH TERRITORY,
 EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT, } ss.

To whom it may concern:

Know ye, that the May term of court for this district having lapsed, and it being deemed expedient to call a September term, in order to provide a jury, for the coming October term of court,

Now, therefore, I, George W. Emery, governor of the territory of Utah, by virtue of the authority in me vested, do, by this my proclamation, change the time of holding court in and for the 3d judicial district of said territory of Utah, as follows, to wit:

The district court, in and for the 3d judicial district, shall be held in the city and county of Salt Lake on the 4th Thursday in the month of September, on the 2d Monday in the month of October, on the 1st Monday in the month of February, on the 1st Monday in the month of May, of each year hereafter, unless otherwise ordered by the governor; the court to convene at each regular term thereof, at the hour of 11 o'clock, a.m.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused the great seal of the territory to be affixed.

Done at Salt Lake City, this thirteenth day of September, A.D. 1875, and of the independence of the United States the one hundred and eighth.

PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.
 EXECUTIVE OFFICE, } ss.

To all whom it may concern:

Know ye, that I, Geo. W. Emery, Governor of said Territory, by virtue of the authority in me vested, do hereby assign and transfer the Hon. Jacob S. Boreman, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of this our said territory, from the Second Judicial District to the Third Judicial District thereof, with full power and authority to do and perform all acts and duties pertaining to the office of Judge of the Third Judicial District, within the said Territory of Utah. The former assignment of Hon. J. S. Boreman, bearing date April 23rd, A.D., 1873, is hereby revoked.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused the great seal of the Territory to be affixed.

DIED.

At Cedar City, April 28th, after an illness of several months, GEORGE CARY, aged 67 years.

Bro. Cary was born in England in the year 1808; in 1817 emigrated with his parents to Quebec, and for a time they settled in Perth; then he removed to Bathurst, and thence to the township of Plumton. In 1843 he heard the Gospel as revealed to Joseph Smith, preached, and was baptized; in 1846 removed with his family to Nauvoo, and in 1847 crossed the plains in Elder Taylor's company, and settled in Salt Lake City; in 1849, by counsel, removed to Provo, where he resided until called to come to this place, in November, 1853, where he has resided ever since, laboring diligently to build up the place and sustain his family.

Also, at the same time and place, MARGARET, wife of the above named George Cary, of dropsy, after an illness of about three months.

Sister Margaret Cary was born in Scotland, in the year 1814; in 1820, with her parents, removed to Canada and settled in Plumton; in 1838 was married to Bro. Geo. Cary, and became the mother of thirteen children, six of whom are dead and seven living; was baptized in 1844; was a woman of great faith, a good mother and neighbor.

Father and Mother Cary lived very happily together for about 37 years. She died in about an hour after her husband. A short while before Father Cary died, he whispered to some of his family that he was waiting for his wife to go with him.—[COM.]

At Nephi, Sept. 12, of aneurism, MARY JANE, wife of Benjamin Riches, aged 44 years and 9 days.

Deceased was a consistent member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints 27 years.
