Mrs. Modell Succeeded at Aurora, Wyoming.

AN EXCEEDINGLY STRANGE CASE.

The Terrible Deed Committed Before a Large Mirror.

J. W. Steyer returned this morning from Aurora where he was called just evening by the death of Mrs. Modell by suicide. Mr. Steyer brings some additional information regarding the sad affair. About 2 o'clock in the afternoon Mrs. Modell's sister, the wife of the agent there, whose name is also Modell, went out to bring in some water. About the same time the young man who is working there as operator during the temporary absence of the agent, had gone out on the platform to company with a friend, a young gentleman.

Mrs. Modell, the deceased, had stepped into the bedroom next to the office and apparently slipped before a mirror and shot herself. It is believed some large glass, and from the position in which the body was found it is supposed that Mrs. Modell held the revolver right hand. The ball entered directly in the top of her head and passed down through the brain, she fell backward and expired instantly. Her sister, Mrs. Modell, and the young gentleman, rushed to the scene. She had fallen directly back from the mirror. Her head was turned to the left and the revolver lay at her side. She lay in this position when Mr. Steyer reached Aurora last night. Nothing has been disturbed. Mr. Steyer took charge of the woman's body and placed it in a coffin, and they will be shipped to Ogden tonight.

No reason is known why the deceased should have suicided. She was to a delicate condition and the only reason that can be assigned for the act is that she was laboring under a temporary aberration of the mind. The peculiar method of the deed is an evidence of this. There was no old gun, and also a revolver in the house but no one knew that there was a cartridge anywhere around.

The deceased's home is at Rock Springs. Her husband is in Ogden on business. She left no note or communication of any kind to any one. She was about twenty-seven years of age and a highly respected young lady. She had often remarked that she would never shoot herself because she would not have the courage to do such a thing. Indeed she made this remark only a day or two before her death. It is thought that she may have said this for the purpose of throwing her sister and friends off their guard.

SHOOTING SCARE.

County Assessor Met Murr has returned from Henry's Fork and brings an account of a shooting affair that occurred near there over a land controversy. He saw the injured man brought in. His wound was painful though not necessarily fatal and he was taken to Carter station, where he was formerly employed as a landman. Only meager accounts were obtainable, and even they were conflicting. It is believed that the shooting was the result of a quarrel over a mining claim instead of a land dispute. The quarrel in the office was not the effect that the trouble grew from a misunderstanding concerning a mining claim and was of several weeks' standing. The parties met on May 15th when hostilities were renewed and Nelson pulled his revolver and shot his antagonist.

Another version of the affair is that Watson tried to jump some land, the property of Nelson and when the latter endeavored to persuade Watson to let him have some of the pasture and move away, he pulled a knife on Nelson, who promptly beat a retreat to his cabin and getting his rifle, returned where Watson was. He then renewed his request for Watson to leave his ranch at once, but Watson was stubborn and the shooting followed.

Whichever way it was, the shooting actually occurred and Watson carries the bullet.

AN OLD CHRISTENING SCENE.

A remarkable christening ceremony was held at the home of Fred T. Weather and wife, in Springfield, Mass., the other day, when their infant daughter was named Elizabeth. There were four generations on hand to witness the ceremony, while a great-grandmother, two grandmothers and a grandmother alternately carried the little one, who was the center of attraction. Elizabeth C. Hubbard, of Hartford, Mrs. Weather's father, came up with a "baby's baby" printed in ink, and surrounded by members of the Hubbard family since 1844 until the leaves are worn back in the center.

From the strange look of this illustration, the story of Christ's Mother little children was read by Rev. C. H. Fay, who is the second husband of the child's great-grandmother, and then, as if little Elizabeth would never make the second christening, she was dressed in a christening robe made by Ann Maria Blomson for her infant granddaughter, May A. FARM AND GARDEN.

SUBJECTS OF PRACTICAL IMPORTANCE TO AGRICULTURISTS.

A folding rack described by Mr. Fennell, by an Ohio farmer and recently described, with appropriate illustrations, in The Country Gentleman.

Now, for the rack or side piece, take strips of planer, 2 by 5 inches, 4 feet long, cut into through each, 26 inches from ends that you intend to set the rack, and cut the ends so as to fit against the sides of the box; then, with these together, and with your four cross pieces (Fig. 2), make a strong frame, about 1 by 10 inches. If for drying, having your cross pieces 1 foot apart, but your boards, one on the upper edge of each cross piece as shown in Fig. 3. Then you can fold it up to any width in use. Now make your standard for the front (Fig. 4) 1 foot long and 3 by 2 inches, and bolt on the front end of the rack a piece of board from the slat shown in the cut (Fig. 5), so as to make two loops, and let the ends of the standard pass into the loops, and bolt it.

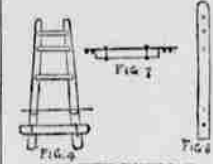
