Suspicion of murder was aroused, and a meeting of over eighty people was held to determine whether they would hang Scully, or wait until they knew whether he deserved hanging. Luckily for Scully, they decided upon the latter course. Scully felt under obligations to his own famlly, his neck being in danger, to find the missing man. He was successful in finding his supposed victim alive and hearty in Bureau County, and produced him to the satisfaction, it is to be hoped, of the eighty citizens who were ready the altar of justice.
