THE WORLD'S FAIR.

Clouds and Rain Keep Many Visitors Away From the Grounds.

THE DISCORD IN THE ORCHESTRA.

Exhibitors Putting Their Exhibits in Shape.—Encouraging Progress Made.

CHICAGO, May 11.—The lowering skies and downpouring rain this morning had the effect of keeping many persons away from the World's Fair grounds, but, as the day wore on, the clouds thinned and the prospects seemed better for a good attendance.

The committee investigating the charges of favoritism by the department of music, under the chairmanship of Mr. J. L. Latham of Lake City, returned its report this morning. A Chicago Bank Fails.

CHICAGO, May 11.—The Columbia National bank, this city, failed this morning. It had a capital of \$1,000,000 and deposits amounting to \$1,400,000. It was founded in 1887, and had been in business nearly a week. It had business with many country banks, mostly, and was not in esteem among the other city banks.

RAWLINS RETURNS.

He Is Interviewed by a "News" Reporter This Afternoon.

HE CALMLY DISCUSSES HIS ACT.

The Prospects Now Are That He Will Soon Withdraw His Resignation.

Delaware Rawlins has returned and will probably withdraw his resignation. The fact that he is now seriously contemplating such a step has caused considerable speculation in the Democratic circles.

Yesterday a delegation of leading Democrats went out on the road to meet Mr. Rawlins and present matters before him as they were regarded by the party and friends at home. The party was not a large one, but was made up of the most prominent and influential leaders in the Democratic ranks, and already there are indications that victory will prove on their banners as a result of their visit.

Mr. Rawlins arrived home today and this afternoon he was found in his private law office behind a pyramid of telegrams and correspondence. He welcomed the News reporter cordially and in response to questions said:

"Personally I would very much like to make known fully the circumstances which led me to send in my resignation. But certain grave public considerations make it best that I should not divulge them, therefore I cannot give any specific reasons at present."

"I want to state positively, however, that the appointment of Mr. Richards as secretary of the Territory is in no way contributed to my action. I also want to state that I never anticipated the appointment of Mr. Richards. While I endorsed Mr. Young, I did not work for anyone in particular and those who see in a position to know are aware of this fact."

"Before endorsing Mr. Young I personally asked Mr. Richards if there was any office that he wished, and he positively replied there was not; that he was not a candidate for political favors of any kind. I therefore gave my endorsement to Mr. Young as an act of friendship and not as a political move."

"I first went to President Cleveland to consult with him on the reorganization of the Utah commission. The secretaryship was only incidentally alluded to but the President informed me that he would not appoint Mr. Young and that he did not feel inclined to give the office to Mr. Richards. Mr. Cairns was his choice and he was very anxious that the secretaryship should go to him. While contemplating Mr. Cairns's appointment, he received a telegram from Mr. Richards stating that he was declining to accept the office. I then presented the name of Professor Paul as the President's consideration. I made plain his ability and the good would be done for the territory. President Cleveland said to himself, 'just the man and telegraphed to Governor West who immediately wired back that he was declining to accept the office. I was then asked to select another man and would give him the satisfaction. It was soon after this that Mr. Richards was appointed and I immediately telegraphed him my congratulations."

"Mr. Rawlins was again asked by the reporter for some reason as to his resignation. He replied that there was a number of things that led to it that were unpleasant to publish over. He stated that he had been asked to resign and only as a matter of duty to his party and the people of Utah did he consent to become a candidate. "With this idea burning in my mind I came to the conclusion that I could not successfully serve them. Now I am satisfied that the exposure of friendship and respect that I have received and that I was indebted to in this connection I wish to state as plain as I can and will be in a fit of passion, or through spite or jealousy that only acted as a did after a careful consideration of the conditions placed before me and which appeared to exist elsewhere as well. Under the circumstances I felt that I was morally bound to resign."

"Did you at any time intimate, Mr. Rawlins, that Church Indians were being oppressed against you or that Mr. Richards's appointment was secured through bribery?"

"I never did and absolutely never thought of it. I say only a thing about the fact that I was asked to resign and that I declined to do so."

"On the contrary, I think I have never been exercised at all. It would have been against and not for the appointment of Mr. Richards. No, sir, you can say to the public and to the Church that I had nothing to do with my resignation."

"I will you withdraw your resignation, Mr. Rawlins?"

"Viewing the matter in the light of everything as it now exists I am not inclined to say that my result will be, but I think that all will end well. Nothing would lead me to continue in the office outside of a hearty 'yes' given me by the people of Utah. I am charged with a heavy task of duty and I am willing to sacrifice all personal matters. Where that duty is, I cannot say on this point. I have received today a telegram from Professor Paul and other leading Democrats, as well as other citizens of Utah, who are pleading their friendship, faith and support, and I appreciate their expressions of confidence beyond price."

UTAH ASKED TO CONTRIBUTE \$2000.

The Real Estate Exchange is Getting Down to Work.—Mining and Other Notes.

There is a proposition to establish an illustrated weekly, probably to be published in Chicago, to the silver interest, and to send it to Utah to be contributed the sum of \$2000.

The details of the scheme were laid before a committee of mining men last evening, by W. H. Harvey of Ogden. Mr. Harvey and several Denver gentlemen formulated the proposition.
