Spanish Report Says the U. S. Fleet Accomplished this on its Second Attack.

Announcement that the Battle at Santiago Began Before 9 o'clock This Morning—Claim that Sixteen Spanish War Vessels Came Today to Reinforce Cervera.

Madrid, June 2.—The Pina, a prominent republican organ, says it is rumored that the United States fleet has made a second attack upon Santiago de Cuba, and that the American forces entered the harbor.

Spanish circles here the report is not believed to be true.

New has reached here that a battle began at Santiago before 9 o'clock this morning."

The correspondent here of the Associated Press has been informed from an apparently authentic source at Port Antonio, this island, that a Spanish fleet from Cuba is moving West Indian waters, and should it arrive on the peninsula it will be off Santiago de Cuba tomorrow to reinforce the fleet of the Spanish admiral Cervera.

The Spanish fleet is said to consist of sixteen warships, among them being battleships and three torpedo boats.

The British second class cruiser Indefatigable, Captain Geo. A. Pritchard, has sailed for Santiago with several doctors on board, in order to watch the impending battle and aid the wounded.
