All Evidence Is in and the Hearing Ends Until Octo-

TWO DAYS FOR ARGUMENTS.

Mr. Habcock for Commercial Club Teaffie Bureau Says He Is Oulte Satisfied With Hearing.

The case of the Sait Lake Commerdal club traffic bureau against the raticonds entering Salt Lake City, charging them with gross discrimination against the shippers of this state, curne to an end in the federal court noon yesterday afternoon.

Five days had been consumed in the presentation of testimony, that of the raffic bureau for the complainants, and the Harriman lines, the Denyer & Rio Grande, the Cidcago, Rock Island & Pacific and the Missouri Pacific, constituting the whole list of defendants

placing evidence before the interstate commerce commission.

At the conclusion of the hearing, which for the piest three days has been conducted before Commissioner E. E. liark, on account of Commissioner Prouty's absence in Portland, where he went to take testimony. Commissioner Clark announced that four members of the commission would return to Salt Lake Oct. 29 to bear arguments on the case just presented. Only two days, it is understood, will be al-lowed for hearing arguments of both

Mr. Bubcock, for the local traffic bureau, made the following announce-ment at the close of the hearing: ment at the close of the hearing:

"The case of the Commercial club traffic bureau before the interstate commerce commission has been presented in the most complete and satisfactory manner possible. YESTERDAY'S SESSION


