THE news will be received with general satisfaction, that the chief manager of the Philadelphia medical institution, which has been for years issuing bogus diplomas at \$25 ing elder in the apiece, has at last come to grief. The H. Findlay. name of this notorious person is John Buchanan, and he has figured eling elder in the Lundee Conferas "Dean of the American University of Philadelphia," "Dean of the Eclectical Medical College of Pennsylvania," "President of the National Medical Eclectic Association," and, under the alias of James Murray, D.D., as "Dean of the Livingston University of America."
