

[BY AUTHORITY.]

AN ACT

To Prohibit the use of certain Paper as Money.

Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the Governor and Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Utah: That any person, private corporation, firm or association issuing or circulating any note, check, memorandum, token, or other obligation for use as money in lieu of lawful money, or other lawful medium of exchange, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, on conviction thereof in any court having jurisdiction, be punished for each offence by fine not exceeding one thousand dollars, to be paid into the Territorial Treasury or by imprisonment not exceeding six months, or by both fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 2. This act shall not be construed to in any manner apply to Territorial, County, or City paper, nor to prevent any person from returning the class of paper prohibited in this act, but issued or in circulation previous to the time this act takes effect, to the person, corporation, firm, or association purporting to have issued it; and if said person, corporation, firm, or association refuses or neglects to pay or redeem the aforesaid paper when it is presented for payment, or to make satisfactory arrangements for paying or redeeming it, he shall, in addition to the amount claimed on the paper so returned, be liable for all loss that may accrue through such neglect or refusal; and the interest on the aforesaid amount shall be calculated and paid at the rate of six per cent. per month, during the time of such neglect or refusal.
