San Franciscoans Felt Aggreived At Turning Over of Relief Work to Dr. Devine.

WHAT HURT THEM THE MOST

San Francisco, April 24 .--- This was the seventh day since the earthquake jarred the city so severely and started the fires that laid ft in ashes, and, as with the preceding days, Tuesday took up the accumulated impetus of Monday and added such volume of force of its own that Wednesday will dawn on a situation that is a long day toward the normal.

RESUMING BUSINESS.

Such marts of trade as remain unburned were opening for the transaction of ordinary business, temporary structures were being run up for acstructures were being run up for ac-commodation of others, clearing of the devastated area of its ruins was well under way, the inquiry into the con-dition of the bank vaults was com-pleted, the organization and prepara-tion for service of the street railways were so far advanced that the company expressed its readiness to resume business as soon as the mayor would ermit; the water company announced completion of such repairs as abled it to supply a total of 12,000,000 gallons daily—in fine, there was all the evidence to put at rest now and forever the fears of those who predict-ed that San Francisco would never rise again.

SURPRISED AT PRESIDENT.

The citizens of San Francisco had done so splendidly in the face of such an appalling catastrophe that some little consternation was created this morning when President Roosevelt's proclamation was read, turning over to Dr. Edward Devine of the National Red Cross the management of relief measures and the distribution of the great funds so generously appropriated by Congress, and recommending to the people of the United States that their contributions of food and supplies and money should be diverted into the same hands.

HE WAS MISINFORMED.

If there was a momentary feeling that the men who had endured the heat and burden of the day were being unfairly treated by this diversion of authority into new and foreign keep-ing, it was soon dissipated by the re-flection that the action of the president flection that the action of the president was the result of misinformation. At a conference at Fort Mason, attended by Gens. Greely and Funston, Mayor Schmitz, Gov. Pardee, Dr. Devine and some others, it was agreed that this was the case and that Dr. Devine him-self should frame a telegram to the president, informing him of the splen-did work already done and of the per-fect willingness to assist in forwarding president, informing him of the splen-did work already done and of the per-fect willingness to assist in forwarding the measures already taken. PHILIPPINE RAILROADS.

Civil Engineers Who Will Build Them

Leave Kansas City.

Kansas City, Mo., April 25.—The first corps of civil engineers sent to con-struct railroads for the United States government in the islands of Panay, Negros, and Cebu left Kansas City last night on a special train over the Bur-lington for Seattle, whence they will sail for the Philippines on the steamer Minnesota on Saturday next. The party includes doctors, stenographers men and in front an entire rallcoad organization. Philippine native labor is to be used entirely in the actual work of the construction of the actual work and that this party of men will build. The rail-road will be four hundred miles in length. It will be built across the three islands named and will be so located that the connecting steamboat lines may most easily connect with the rail-way termini of the different islands, thus making a continuous line of transportation from the main island of Luzon to the furthermost island. Cebu. The cost of this railroad will approx-imate \$12,000,000, and it is to be completed within about four years. All the supplies for its construction will come from the United States except the ce-ment, which will be brought from China and the ties which will be cut by native labor. The road when completed will be produce in a second be modern in every respect.

Volcano Seems to be Assuming Character of a Dead One.
