

POSTAL AFFAIRS.

Rates of Domestic Postage.
Weight 1 oz. or less, 1 cent.
Single rate letter throughout the country, 1 cent.
For each additional 1/4 oz. or fraction, 1 cent.
Drop Letters, 1 cent, 1 cent.
Newspapers, 1 cent, 1 cent.
Circulars, 1 cent, 1 cent.
Postage due, 1 cent, 1 cent.
Daily (seven times a week) 50c per quarter.
Tri-weekly, 100c.
Monthly, 150c.
Weekly, 200c.
Montly, 250c.
These rates must be prepaid quarterly or monthly at the office where the newspaper is received.
Single newspaper, 1 cent, prepaid.

EXTRADITION.—The standard single rate is 4¢ on avoirdupois.

Bi-monthly, 8¢; quarterly, 12¢; monthly, 16¢.

Samples of merchandise, 10¢; 20¢; 30¢.

Miscellaneous printed matter, 2¢; for each 4 oz. or fraction thereof.

The maximum weight of any package of printed or miscellaneous matter is 4 lbs. avoirdupois.

Registered Letters and Money Orders.

REGISTRATION.—Letters may be registered by the postmaster, or by the government take no responsibility for safe carriage, compensation is case of loss.

GREAT BRITAIN.

On orders not exceeding 10cts., 25cts.

Over 10cts. and not exceeding 20cts., 50cts.

Over 20cts. and not exceeding 30cts., 75cts.

Over 30cts. and not exceeding 40cts., 100cts.

Over 40cts. and not exceeding 50cts., 125cts.

United States and British North America Provinces.

LETTERS.—The standard charge is 1 cent of Canada, irrespective of distance, if prepaid, 6 cents; otherwise, 1 cent. Postage paid in the United States and British North America Provinces, for distance of not over 200 miles, 10 cents.

Rates of Foreign Postage.

The standard single rate to Great Britain is half as much as double to France, Germany, Italy, Spain, Portugal, Russia, Prussia, and one-quarter more avoirdupois. The "P" indicates that prepayment is optional.
