

ROOSEVELT SET TO LOCK THE PANAMA

Should Congress Pass a Bill for a Sea Level Canal. He Would Veto It.

STATEMENT AUTHORITY.

He Approved the Litterer Amendment to \$25,000,000 Appropriation.

Washington, June 15.—If Congress should send a measure to President Roosevelt providing for the construction of a sea level canal on the Isthmus of Panama he would veto it. This statement is made by authority.

The introduction by Representative Litterer today of the amendment to the item in the sundry civil bill appropriating \$25,000,000 to continue the construction of the Panama canal, providing that no part of that sum shall be used in the construction of a sea level canal, was done with the approval of the president.

The house today by a vote of 110 to 56 voted in favor of a lock canal across the Isthmus of Panama, the amendment to this effect being presented by Representative Litterer of New York.

With members of Congress sitting on the short steps in the aisles of the house, around the space in groups, the galleries filled and with Mr. Burton of Ohio, pointer in hand, discussing charts showing the difference between sea level and lock canal, the president presented every appearance of a class room.

PSYCHICAL RESEARCH.

American Branch of the Society Has Dissolved.

Boston, June 15.—It became known last night that the American branch of the Society of Psychical Research, an organization with a membership of 8,000 in this country, has been dissolved. The society's headquarters in this city will be kept open until the first of next year. A new society has been formed in New York and will carry on the work of the defunct society.

SENSATION DAY IN THE LE DOUX MURDER CASE.

Stockton, Cal., June 15.—This was a sensational day in the Le Doux murder trial. Under a battery fire of overruled objections, the prosecution is putting in testimony contradictory of the statements made by the accused to the officers after her arrest. At that time she declares that one Joe Miller had put his body in the trunk. When the prosecution sought to show that there had been no such man as Joe Miller, the defense objected on the ground that the prosecution had already proved by the alleged confession of the defendant that Joe Miller had committed the crime, and that any attempt to show to the contrary was an attempt on the part of the prosecution to contradict its own evidence. Judge Nutter overruled the objection.
