Fatal Railroad Accident.

St. Louis, 28.—A train on the Missouri Pacific road, eight miles west of the city, on a wagon containing W. J. Richey, wife and two children. Richey and wife were killed and one child fatally injured.

Convicted of Bigamy.

Sarah A. Davis, who procured a Utah divorce from her first husband and married the second time, was today found guilty of bigamy in the circuit court of Campbell County, Ky., and sentenced to three years in the penitentiary.

Fatal Shooting Affair.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., 28.—A special correspondent to the Courier-Journal at Danville, telegraphs the following: Walter Saunders, late sheriff of Lincoln County, and brother-in-law of Jack Ballard, was killed last evening at Richmond, Madison County, by George Edwards, a young man, and a party of his friends. The particulars are as follows: As I am able to gather them are as follows: A young brother of Saunders was at the Richmond fair a week ago, during that time he was badly beaten by Edwards. Yesterday Walter Saunders and his friends went to Richmond to attend the trial of young Saunders for his alleged offense. After the trial a conversation occurred between Edwards and Walter Saunders, at the latter's house, during which Saunders denounced Edwards' conduct as brutal and cowardly, at the same time drawing a pistol. About this time Saunders was shot by some other person, but leveling his pistol, made things lively while his strength lasted. When the firing ended, Saunders and his brother-in-law, Ballard, were dead. Marshall Edwards was slightly, and his brother dangerously wounded. Many shots were fired, but only the four persons mentioned struck.

Chicago, 28.—Perin Galt & Co.'s hardware manufacturing establishment at the city workhouse was partially destroyed by fire to-night.

Cigar Maker's Strike.

One hundred and sixty cigar makers in the employ of Krohm & Co., struck to-day. The alleged cause is that they cannot make living wages. The strikers have no doubt, is believed to be to drive women out of the shop.

Coroner's Jury Verdict.

CHICAGO, 28.—The coroner's jury, this afternoon, rendered a verdict that Catherine Brannock, who was shot by William O'Sullivan last night, came to her death either by accident or the design of said Sullivan, but that the jury were unable to determine which. They found that Sullivan shot himself on account of remorse for his deed or from fear of the consequences. The whole affair is as much a mystery as ever.

Senator Morton's Condition.

RICHMOND, Ind., 28.—At 9 o'clock the following official bulletin was issued: Senator Morton's condition is the only report which will be made to-night, unless there should be a change for the worse. Senator Morton is certainly improving and getting along nicely, and we have no doubt of his getting up in time.

Washington Items.

WASHINGTON, 28.—The President and Cabinet are unanimous that Congress should meet in October.

By direction of the Secretary of the Treasury one million dollars will be sold by the Assistant Treasurer, New York, on Saturday at noon, to redeem United States notes to be retired by reason of the issue of national bank notes.

The amount of national bank currency issued during the present month is \$1,301,640.

The United States Consul at Liverpool informs the State Department that neither skilled nor unskilled workmen who come from abroad can find employment in England.

The Commissioner of Internal Revenue has received notice of the arrest of Deputy Marshal Wm. H. Deaver, United States Commissioner Joseph W. Green and his son J. A. Green, at Statesville, North Carolina, for presenting a forged receipt voucher for awards on account of giving information for the arrest of criminals.

It is reported that Chief Justice of the District Supreme Court will decline to honor any requisition which Governor Hampton may make for certain republicans formerly residing in that State and now here, on the ground that he does not regard Hampton as the true Governor of the State.
