AHEARN RE-ELECTED PRESIDENT OF MANHATTAN

New York, Dec. 19.—John D. Ahearn, Democrai, who 10 days ago was relieved of the office of president of the horough of Manhattan by Gov, Hughes, today was elected by the board of aldermen to succeed himself. He received 24 votes, against 12 for Max F. Griffenha-gen, Republican. Ahearn's supporters included all the Democratic members of the board in this borough, and in addition he received the votes of three Republican and four Municipal Owner-ship league aldermen. The galaries of the aldermanic cham-ber were crowded with spectators, and the result of the balloting and the ad-ministration of the oath of office to Ahearn, which immediately followed, were greeted with tremendous cheers. Ahearn's removal by the governor followed an investigation into the af-fairs of the office, which was made at his own request, after charges had been sustained, but in his communication directing the removal of the horough president from office be said that noth-ing had been disclosed which in any way tended to impeach Ahearo's per-sonal honesty.
