

MORE EQUITABLE DIRECTORS RESIGN

They Are A. J. Cassatt, Pres. of Penn. Ry., J. A. Stewart and John Sloane.

D. O. MILLS' WILL COME TODAY

Frick May Go to New York Life—Liberal Cash Offer for Mr. Hyde's Holdings of Stock.

New York, June 6.—Three more directors resigned today from the board of the Equitable Life Assurance society, and at least one more will resign tomorrow, making in all ten resignations since the present troubles of the society began.

The resignation of A. J. Cassatt, president of the Pennsylvania Railroad company, was followed this afternoon by the announcement of the resignations of John A. Stewart, chairman of the board of directors of the United States Trust company, and John Sloane, prominent in banking and trust company circles. The resignations of D. O. Mills will be handed to President Alexander tomorrow. Mr. Mills was at first inclined to postpone action, but decided not to attend the meeting.

The other directors who have resigned from the Equitable board are H. C. Frick, E. H. Harriman, T. Jefferson Coffey, M. E. Dugan, Jacob H. Schiff and Cornelius N. Bliss.

The call for tomorrow's meeting of the Equitable directors gives notice that immediately upon adjournment of the regular meeting a special meeting will be held for the following purposes:

First—Of amending the by-laws so as to provide for the office of chairman of the board of directors and prescribing the powers and duties of the office, and passing upon such other amendments to the by-laws as may be submitted to the meeting.

Second—For the election of a chairman of the board to fill the office thus created.

Third—For the election of the chairman as a director of the society. President Alexander was before Superintendent Hendricks for examination today.

Among the stories which gained circulation today was one to the effect that Henry C. Frick has been offered a position on the board of directors of the New York Life Insurance company, and that he is seriously considering the offer.

Mr. Frick resigned as a director of the Equitable last week, when the report of the investigating committee, of which he was the head, was not accepted by the board of directors.

There was a conference tonight, at which Mr. Frick was present with his legal adviser, Samuel Untermyer. According to the Herald, there was a full and free discussion of the selection of a suitable man for the position of chairman of the board, and the selection of Gov. Hendricks as president.

The same paper says that report has it that before leaving for Cleveland, Gov. Hendricks expressed his willingness to take hold of the Equitable, providing he was given absolute freedom of action, and it was added that he was assured he would be unhampered in his management.

"It is said," the Herald adds, "that Gov. Hendricks, as the representative of the syndicate, had made a liberal offer to Mr. Hyde's stockholdings; that if a transfer were made the control of the society would not only be vested in him as chairman of the board, with plenary powers, but in fact he would be in absolute control."

MOROCCAN SITUATION CAUSES SOME UNEASINESS

Paris, June 6.—The cabinet discussion today, following the general Moroccan situation, did not include a definite decision regarding the response which France was making to the ultimatum's proposition for an international conference. This question will be dealt with subsequently.

The resignation of M. Delcasse has caused much uneasiness in parliamentary quarters, where a pessimistic view prevails concerning the relations between France and Germany. Some deputies declare that a situation involving possibilities of war has been narrowly averted, and that it will be difficult even now to reconcile the differences already created.

Premier Rouvier appeared to give some ground for this view, when he appealed to the deputies not to press their interpellations regarding Morocco, saying that pending conditions require the fullest exercise of patriotism.

Some of the evening papers give sensational prominence to the lack of preparedness of French defenses on the German border. However, the Temps presents a more conservative view, declaring that the past error in seeking to ignore Germany must now be changed to a method of conciliation, an equal desire in that direction being displayed on both sides.

"The interests at stake," says the Temps, "are in the highest degree susceptible of arrangement, and both parties, agreeing in wishing for a solution, will doubtless work together with frankness and good will in order to attain it."

This is the prevailing tone of the influential press.

SUBMARINE BOATS.

Those that Were Used by Togo Made in America.

San Francisco, June 6.—The Call says that the T. Egan of New York, now registered at a local hotel, has been in the city for several months, off and on, directing the shipments of munitions of war to Japan. It has been learned that he had charge of the secret shipment to Japan of a fleet of submarine boats that performed such hazardous service in the great naval battle in the sea of Japan.

Egan is the representative of a Japanese firm in New York, who have been the medium through which Japan has been purchasing her material for war.

The firm not only operated at this point, but have shipped tons of war material from Seattle and Victoria and their own failures was the refusal of local customs authorities to clear the liner Adachi with her cargo of shells. The firm is said to have handled millions of dollars for the Tokyo government and disbursed the greater part of this money in this country.
