CAUSES MIXED EMOTIONS.

Senator Newlands' Resolution Inviting Cuba into the Union.

Havana, Nov. 22.—The joint resolution introduced in the United States senate by Mr. Newlands on Friday, inviting Cuba to become a state of the United States has occasioned a great deal of comment here. Many Cubans are amused by it, while some prominent Spaniards and other persons of foreign birth favor the idea.

In the course of an interview had with him by the correspondent of the Associated Press, President Palma commented with seriousness upon the provisions of the resolutions. He said that while there might possibly be some time when the majority of the residents of Cuba would have favored voluntary action, that time had passed, the stability of the Cuban government having become so well established that the Cubans had no other desire than to perpetuate and loyally support it.

Besides this, Cuba's political and commercial relations with the United States were now being settled in a manner so eminently satisfactory that it would be impossible to organize a movement of any importance in the direction of action.

President Palma spoke in terms of the warmest commendation of President Roosevelt's efforts for reciprocity, and said he believed the affirmative vote in the house was chiefly due to the president's influence.

Would Like to be Annexed.

St. Johns, N. F., Nov. 22.—United States Senator Lodge's recent declaration respecting St. Pierre and Miquelon becoming a part of the American Republic has excited great interest in St. Pierre. That colony has had the worst fishery season in its history, trade here is depressed and the outlook is gloomy. The people are ready to welcome any settlement of the fishery dispute that will insure them prosperity, and the feeling in favor of annexation to the United States finds much favor.

Anglo-Italian Arbitration Treaty London, Nov. 22.—The Rome correspondent of the Daily Mail says that during the conference at Windsor Thursday last between King Victor Emmanuel and King Edward a permanent Anglo-Italian arbitration treaty was approved by both monarchs.

DINGLEY RATES ARE TOO HIGH.

Col. Edwards, of Bureau of Insular Affairs, Emphasizes Necessity for Their Reduction.

NEEDED FOR GROWTH OF TRADE.

Matter of Next Serious Moment is Question of Bottoms for the Carrying Trade.

Washington, Nov. 22.—The development of the Philippine islands during the past year is displayed in the annual report of Col. Clarence R. Edwards, chief of the bureau of insular affairs of the war department, made public today. The accomplishment of greatest importance to the islands during the year has been the successful launching of the new fiscal system. By January next the new system will be in complete operation.

NEW CIRCULATION.

The new circulation medium consists of 18,000,000 pesos in fractional silver coins and 10,000,000 pesos in paper money. To establish the new system and purchase the silver coins, two issues of bonds were made of \$3,000,000 each, both of which were sold at a premium. The proceeds of the sale of the bonds of the rate of 3 1/2 per cent, so that the government actually made money by going into debt.

TARIFF REDUCTION NEEDED.

Col. Edwards emphasizes the necessity of a reduction of the Dingley tariff rates for the encouragement of trade between the United States and the Philippines. There is an active desire on the part of the Philippine commercial interests, he says, for tariff concessions, and the report states that the same desire has been evinced by the same interests in this country.

The chief exports of the islands to the United States are sugar, tobacco, hemp and copra. The latter two commodities are already on the free list.

CARRYING TRADE.

Aside from the tariff question, the matter of most serious moment is the enforcement of the congressional act requiring the carrying trade between the United States and the Philippines, as well as the coastwise trade of the islands to be confined strictly to vessels carrying the American flag, after July 1 next. At the present time Philippine commerce is carried in British ships to the extent of 58 per cent of the foreign trade of the islands.

FOREIGN VESSELS.

Other foreign vessels carried practically the remainder of this commerce. A fleet of at least 18 ships is being constructed, and the prediction is made that, despite the apprehension now felt by American shipbuilders, it will be ready to take the place of foreign vessels without seriously inconveniencing the shipping interests. The enforcement of this act, however, with reference to the coastwise trade, presents a much more difficult problem. There are now 4225 vessels engaged in the coastwise trade of the islands. Of this number only 22 are American ships. With the whole number of ships now participating in this trade, the tonnage is said to be entirely inadequate and the passenger service wretched.

LIGHT DRAFT VESSELS.

It is suggested that the building of light draft vessels to participate in this carrying business represents a splendid opportunity for the profitable investment of American capital, and the uncertainty as to probable future congressional action on this subject is asserted to be the reason why no steps are being taken to supply the coming imperative demand for American-built ships.

ADMINISTRATIVE CHANGES.

Col. Edwards calls attention to what he terms "the second stage of development for the Philippine government." The change from military to a civil government has developed many intricate questions of law. A number of cases involving claims aggregating the large sums are now pending in the United States court of claims, while other questions are before the circuit courts of this country. The recovery of import and export duties collected under the old tariff system forms the basis for most of the claims. One of the questions of most interest presented is that of the right of the president of the United States to exercise the power of legislation in the Philippines prior to the establishment of a civil government.

EDUCATION OF FILIPINOS.

The education of Filipino youths in this country for the purpose of making them the future teachers of the native schools of the islands has begun under an act passed last June by the insular government. Ninety-eight young Filipinos are now on their way to this country for that purpose. They will attend the grammar schools of southern California during the winter and in the spring be distributed through the west and eastern portion of the United States for further instruction.

Col. Edwards predicts that the Philippine exhibit at St. Louis will be the feature of that show. Every phase of native industry and domestic life in the islands is to be represented.

THE CIVIL SERVICE.

Through an amendment to the civil service regulations of the United States, made by President Roosevelt, to take effect April 16 next, transfers will be allowed from the civil employees of the Philippine government to positions in this country, thus accomplishing an end which has been vigorously contended for by Col. Edwards for some time, and making efficient service in the Philippines a stepping stone to better places at home, and thus raising the standard of efficiency and creating a new inducement to desirable clerks.

Bull Kills a Boy.

Durango, Colo., Nov. 22.—Walter Marlow, the 10-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. W. D. Marlow, was killed by a bull yesterday afternoon. Some cattle were being driven by the schoolhouse when a bull broke into the school yard and chased the little boy until he fell, and the bull trampled on him and broke a rib and injured him internally. The injury was received at 1 o'clock and the boy died at 4 o'clock. The body will be shipped to Colorado Springs, the home of the boy's grandfather.

Miss Oldcastle Married.

New York, Nov. 22.—Josephine, Countess Castel-Vecchio, better known as Miss Oldcastle of the Rose-Coghlin company, was married this afternoon at the Greek Orthodox church in Twenty-seventh street to Cavaliero Prof.

Antonio Frabastila, oldest son of the Duke of Castel Saraceno, Marquis of Saraceno of Basilicata, near Naples. The professor lately occupied the chair of language in the University of Athens, Greece.

The ceremony, which was given with the full and impressive Greek church ritual, was followed by a reception to the bride and groom at the studio of Helen Watson Phelps, in West Fifty-seventh street.

Mrs. Alice Carey Insane.

Indianapolis, Ind., Nov. 22.—Mrs. Alice Carey, wife of Gen. John T. Carey, who served as United States district attorney at San Francisco for many years, was declared insane at Marion yesterday. She went there and tried to pawn a diamond ring worth \$400 for \$1. Mrs. Carey was a niece of Col. John Bridge and was a favorite in Washington and New York society. She was a woman of many accomplishments and attracted attention wherever she went. She visited Europe when Bridge was in the consular service, and while there mastered five of the European languages. Her married life was not happy, and she returned to this state and soon lost all her property through her investments. The ring which she offered to pawn was the only thing of value she had saved from the wreck of her fortune.

Price of Oil Increases.

Vienna, Nov. 22.—Much indignation is expressed over the steadily increasing price of oil. Since the formation of the Austro-Hungarian petroleum cartel prices have been advanced 50 per cent, with the prospect that they will go still higher as soon as the present stock becomes exhausted. The advance inflicts the greatest hardship on the poorer classes.

The local authorities of the several districts are urging the city council to use every means to break up the oil monopoly, but there is not the slightest prospect that these efforts will be successful. Both the Standard Oil company and the Deutsche bank are continuing their efforts to come to an agreement with the cartel regarding the German market, but a strong section of the Austrian refiners wish the cartel to remain independent of both parties.

Croatians Attack Hungarians.

Graz, Nov. 22.—Croatian peasants of Nagyk, near Nagyveny, in Transylvania, Friday last organized a murderous attack on their Hungarian neighbors. The Croats assembled during the day and turned themselves with revolvers, sticks and hay forks and at nightfall attacked the Magyar houses and dragged the inmates into the streets. One farmer was beaten to death and most of the Hungarians were injured, many severely.

Russian Troops Praised.

St. Petersburg, Nov. 22.—A military order is published here praising the conduct of the troops in what it describes as an affair between the soldiers and a mob at Orsha, in the district of Vilna, Nov. 19.
