

CAPTAIN OF POLICE.

The Office Was Repealed to Get Rid
of Captain Parker.

IT HAS NOT BEEN RE-CREATED.

Officer Absolved Last Night.—Seg-
ment Park Express—General
Discussion.

A special meeting of the City Council was held last night. President Loveland having returned from Salt Lake occupied the chair.

Half a call showed the following members present: Rich, Harry, Farnum, Horn, Bell, Dawson, Davis, Simonds, Evans, Moran.

The action of the new compilation of city ordinances was taken up, the question of appointment and removal of officers being first considered.

COUNCIL APPROVES ORDERS.

Each moved to strike out the words "and no officer shall be removed except by cause" and incorporate the following in the ordinance from the city council: "All officers appointed by the Council may be removed at any time by vote of a majority of two-thirds of all Council, and any officer may be suspended until the disposition of charges presented against him."

Lawson—Whenever the city becomes dissatisfied, with one of its officers it should have the right to discharge him just the same as our friends or firm can dispense with the services of an employee with whom they had become displeased.

The motion to strike out passed.

CAPTAIN OF POLICE.

When Mr. Loveland recited the office of Captain of Police, he called attention to the fact that the office was created October 21st, 1875, and it was abolished February 17th, 1887. There was, however, an ordinance creating the salary for that position, as the office was first in existence when it was created.

Fisher—There is no law authorizing the police captain, and, as far as I am concerned, the office of Captain of Police was abolished for the reason that we had changed and were to change the name of the office to Captain of Police, and this was never done.

Bell—That motion will be withdrawn at this meeting.

CITY COUNCILS.

Hendry—I move that the three city councils be adjourned from the act of adjournment.

Horn—Second the motion and direct me to the reason that I think the office should be left, from the police force, from among the two men left by the action of the Council.

Horn—Then those will be recessed to the number of two-thirds.

Fisher—This certainly would be retrospective because these appointments can not be made except by and with the approval and consent of the council.

The motion to strike out was carried.

OFFICIAL POLICING.

There was a prolonged discussion on the appointment of special policemen by the mayor.

Mr. Loveland—My majority appointed a special policeman. He was engaged and his name was placed on the payroll same time before it was presented in the Council. The police commissioners were not present, but the powers in the promises, the man worked constantly at work, faithfully.

Hendry—That the Mayor is responsible to report to the Council all appointments of special police officers at the next regular meeting of the Council after such appointments are made.

Moore—I contend that the motion was an improper one, because as it conflicted with the charter conferred upon the City by the Territorial Legislature.

Evans—Covered the amendment and said that it neither affected, modified, nor altered that charter.

PAUL KELLOGG.

The next question was the appointment of a park ranger or barker at Liberty Park by the Mayor.

Loveland—The Mayor is acting in his right and with the consent of the City Council. He can do it if the members would just have a visit to Liberty Park and you will see the necessity of having a barker there.

The present barker was an official who had allowed that park to fall into a most disgraceful condition. He was an aptly named man, and the park cannot now be repaired.

Bell said the same deplorable condition of affairs existed at Washington and Picnic squares.

The amendment carried.

ASSISTANT CITY ATTORNEY.

The ordinance relating to the appointment of an assistant attorney for the purpose of the administration of office by the city attorney and for whose official acts should be responsible.

Hendry moved that the office be filled by the mayor and consent of the City Council.

Horn moved as a substitute that the city attorney may by and with the consent of the mayor, and the City Council, appoint an assistant attorney, who shall hold his office at the pleasure of the mayor.

Both motions failed but not so that Mr. Loveland's motion was adopted by a unanimous vote of the City Council.

Horn said that the city attorney was responsible not only for the acts of himself but for those of his assistants as well.

Hendry stated the city attorney was under \$2000 bonds and that was more than the following note Ayer, Farnum, Horn, Loveland, Moran, Simonds, Bell, Dawson.

A few additional bills was introduced in the name of the mayor, the object of which will be further explained at the next meeting.

CHIEF TALKS TWO GOALS.

The president read the following from the minutes of the council and suggested it be voted upon with it would greatly facilitate business.

Heads—No member shall speak more than once on the same subject without the consent of the council, unless he is a member of the committee which reported the motion or the committee which reported the motion in which case he shall be privileged to speak and close the debate.
