The Herald's Washington spe-cial says positively that a majority of the Senate fluance committee have agreed to report amendments to the silver bill, providing that all "good morrow," when the rising the funding bonds, namely the 5 the funding bonds, namely the 5, 42, and 4 per cent. bonds, which were sold for gold, shall in any case be redeemable, principal and inter-est, in gold; also restricting the legal tender power of silver to \$25 or \$50; also that Senator Jones will urge an amendment that the Treasury shall be obliged to issue coin certificates; transferable to bearer as receipt for silver bars.
