EVENTS IN THE WEST.

A Record of Occurrences in Neighboring States and Territories.

BAD OUTLOOK FOR CALIFORNIA SHEEP

Quick Travel for Wolves—New Fly Cattle Record—Troughs Ready to Move—Miscellaneous News Items.

Harry Kellon, the six-year-old child of F. M. Kellon of Tree Pine, Cal., was crushed to death beneath the wheels of his father's wagon Thursday on the road between San Rafael and Novato. The family were traveling from their home in San Rafael toward Healdsburg, where the father expected to take his government land.

Walter D. Mansfield of San Francisco has broken the world's record for both outdoor and indoor fly casting. He extended his line a distance of 120 feet, 10 inches. This exceeds by one-half a foot the record made by Leonard in Madison square garden at the famous casting tournament held in the early part of the year, and by seven feet Mansfield's own outdoor record.

The man had a revolver. Police made it appear a case of suicide, but certain discrepancies indicate that the man's death might have been caused by some one else.
