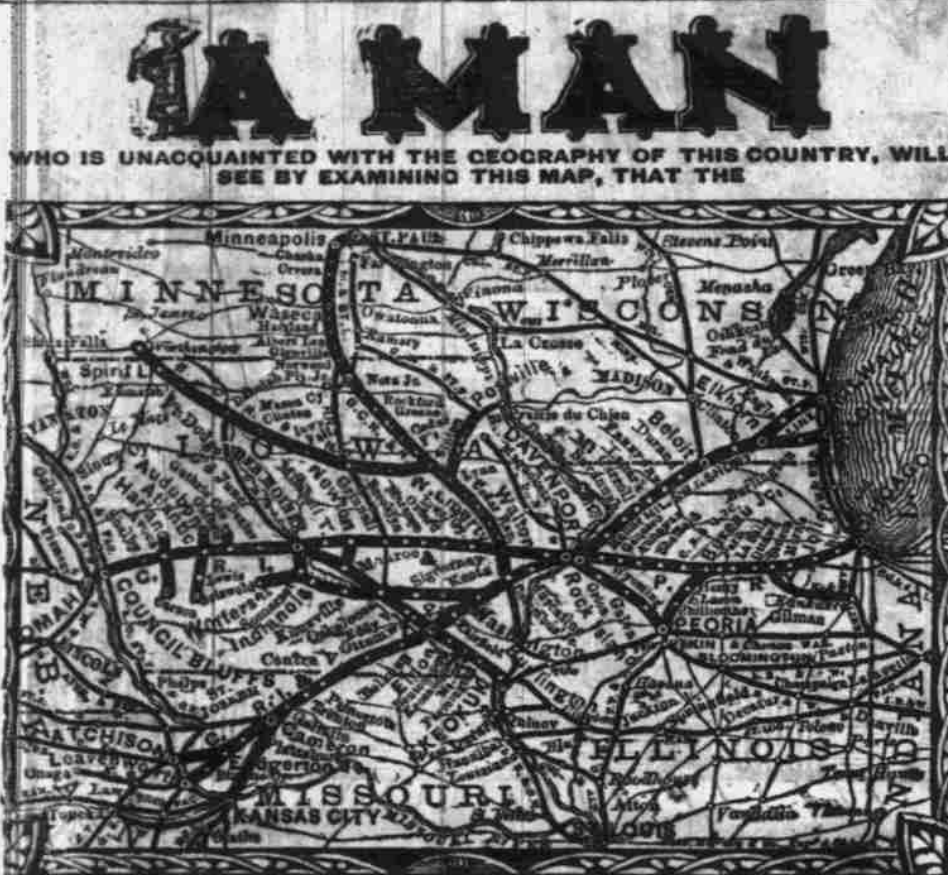

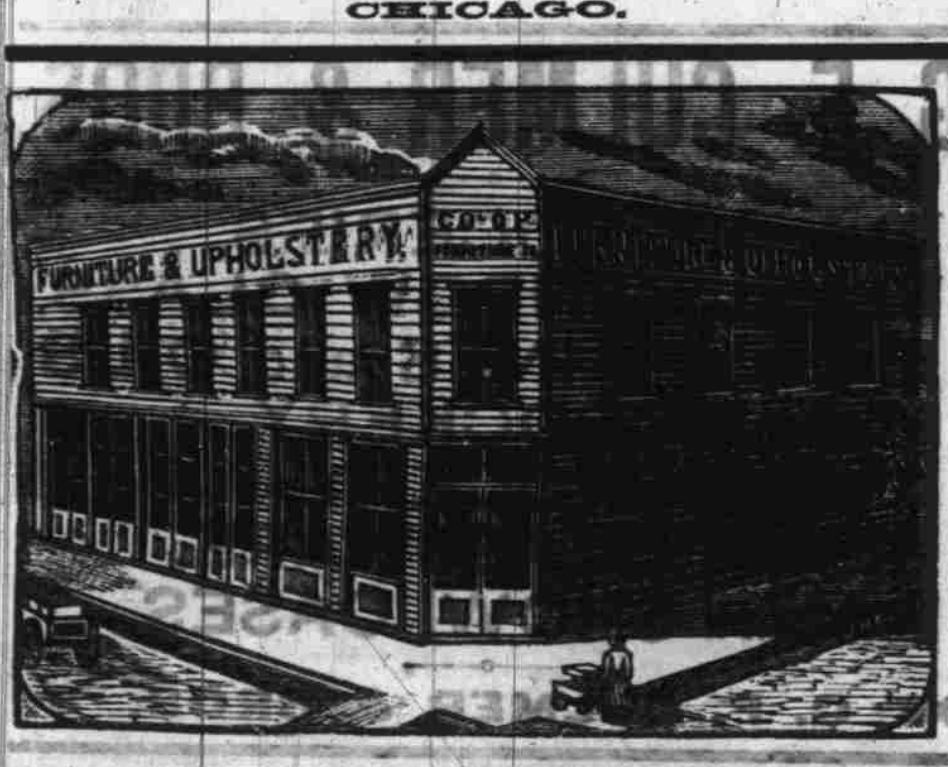

EVENING NEWS.

Thursday, 18th May, 1883.

SANPETER STAKE CONFERENCE.

The Quarterly Conference of the Sanpeter Stake, convened in the hall of the Masonic Temple in Salt Lake City, May 18th, 1883.

Exercises commenced by singing and prayer.

After which addresses were delivered by Elder George Reynolds and President John Taylor, followed by Elder A. H. Lund reading reports of statistics and Sunday School.

President Taylor again addressed the conference, upon the duties and responsibilities of the officers and members of the Church.

Adjourned to 2 p.m.

After the opening exercises the financial report of the Stake was read by Counselor Malben.

President Cannon was the first speaker, and in his address he referred to the Latter-day Saints, some of the effects produced by the revelation and preaching of the Gospel, and the conversion of some of those who were with the Prophet Joseph and afterwards fell away, and showed the necessity of observing the counsel of the Holy Priesthood.

President Woodruff reviewed some of the sayings of the Prophet Joseph and their fulfillment; the requirement made of the Elders to visit the cities with the proclamation of the Gospel, and denunciation that await those who reject it. Exhorting all, both old and young, to read and attend to the scriptures, the revelations of God, in order to become more thoroughly acquainted with the purposes of God and His work among the nations, and with the house of Israel.

President Peterson said the Apostles and Elders accompanying them, had preached to the Saints in the name of the Father, in the name of the Son, and in the name of the Holy Spirit, and that the conference would adjourn to 10 a.m. Sunday, singing and benediction.

Sunday, 10 a.m.

After singing and prayer, Apostle Moses Thatcher addressed the conference, and in his address he alluded to intoxicating drinks, advocated, where practicable, to prohibit the sale of intoxicants, and that where it was necessary to sell, it should be sold in the hands of the people, and not in the hands of the few.

He also alluded to the statistics of the Stake, and exhorted the Saints to purity of life.

Elders John Morgan and W. E. Preston followed in short addresses, exhorting the Saints to faithfulness and the necessity of avoiding the use of strong drink and tobacco, as these habits unfit men for the duties and calling of the Holy Priesthood.

Adjourned to 2 p.m.

After singing and prayer, the benediction was administered. The general state and local authorities were present and all sustained unanimously the report of the conference.

President Geo. Q. Cannon, addressed the conference followed by President Taylor, each reviewing the many blessings and instructions enjoyed by the Saints, and the privilege of carrying the Gospel to the nations that all people may have the privilege of righteousness, and the kingdom of God on the earth.

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Adjourned to 2 p.m.
