WASHINGTON, 17.—The House of Representatives today passed a resolution to pay Plumb back, late contestant to a seat from Louisiana, a sum equal to the amount he had paid for the expenses of a senator from the beginning of the term for which he was contested to the termination of the contest by the Senate, ordered printed and sent to the table.
