LONDON, 17.—Accounts from the district of Gweedore, County Donegal, northwestern Ireland, indicate that the people are most dispirited.

Another ball of Lord Ardilaun's named Flynn, was attacked and left for dead, near Clonbur, County Mayo.

Three members of the Joyce family, witnesses in the Mautrasna trial, while protected by five police men, were attacked in a public house at Churchfield. The police's firearms were taken and used on the Joyces. One was badly wounded.

It is believed the United States Government will refuse the demand for the extradition of Sheridan.

No meeting of Parliament was on Monday, owing to dangerous symptoms of fever, against the Government's leadership. His following is now reduced to half. Dawson and Gray and other well-known members who usually follow the Government have not yet returned.

Several manufacturers state that unless Congress reduces the tariff on iron more than they expect, no reduction will be asked.

New Orleans, 27.—Committees are being appointed by municipal and commercial bodies to properly receive General Porfirio Diaz, ex-President of Mexico, who is expected to arrive Thursday on a Mexican war ship.

New York, 27.—Mary Irene Hoyt, daughter of Jesse Hoyt, committed by her friends to an insane asylum near Philadelphia in June last, has been released, pronounced sane. She says she was put out of the way to keep her from her father's deathbed, and will contest his will on the ground of undue influence. The physicians' certificates upon which her confinement was based, which her father was committed was not filed. The physicians are cited to court to explain.

Omaha, 27.—Red Cloud arrived here today, on his way home from Washington. He was with the Pine Ridge Agency to-morrow. He is rather reticent as to Agent McMillan, who has been retained as agent. He is satisfied with his trip to Washington, and his interview with the Interior Department; and has great expectations of getting pay for ponies taken from him in 1876 by military. He expects about \$14,000.

Warren, Wis., 27.—Seven inches of snow since Saturday; roads blocked; all business at a standstill, even logging and lumbering. Several camps were broken up, and others will follow. Snow three feet deep on the level. Estimated short- age of log crop 40 per cent.

Columbia, O., 27.—J. D. Watson is on trial on a charge of offering to bribe Representative Bick of Cleveland, but Watson's Black testified he had been offered a bribe.
