## PICCHE SURE TO MOVE TO FRONT

Camp No Longer Dependent Upon Any One for Its Success.

## SO SAYS EDWARD THOMARSON

Manager of Big Ely Valley Mine from Which is Brought Fine Report.

Edward Thomarson, manager of the Ely Valley and Horn Silver mines at Ploche, arrived in the city today from the southern Nevada camp which is just awakening from a slumber of a quarter of a century. He expressed himself very enthusiastically over the future of the camp to a representative of the "News" today and declared nothing can keep it from enjoying an unprecedented era of prosperity. The camp is no longer dependent upon any one mine for its success which has been clearly demonstrated by late developments. The coming in of so much new talent from Salt Lake and elsewhere has had a tremendous influence for good and during the past week Mr. Thomarson stated, a party of Los Angeles people have been looking around for a foothold; they have seen Salt Lake mining men come in and take up some of the good things. Hence they are catching the enthusiasm.

Mr. Thomarson brings splendid reports from the Ely Valley where he is conducting a very vigorous development campaign. This is one of the properties visited by Samuel Newhouse several months ago and later by Senator W. A. Clark of Montana, who both regard it as one of the coming big producers of the camp.

## PROVO MINING MEETINGS.

(Special to the "News.")

Provo, Utah, Dec. 10.—A meeting of directors of the Plutus Mining company is scheduled for this afternoon at which time it is expected an assessment will be levied. The Colorado company's directors will also meet later in the day for dividend action. The Grand Central and Victoria companies will probably pass dividend payments this month, while the Sioux Consolidated company will pay eight cents a share.

## NEW GOLD DISCOVERY.

Kanosh Gets Excited Over Find Made By Will Hopkins.

Kanosh, Utah, Dec. 8.—This town is the scene of the latest gold excitement, brought about by a discovery made a few days ago by Will Hopkins of this place at a point about six miles west of here. Hopkins was out in the hills after a load of wood when he picked up a piece of float containing unmistakable evidence of gold. Taking it home, a sufficient amount of the rock was analyzed to make a gold panning, and the result was a string of gold which caused a stampede to the new eldorado. A genuine Nevada rush ensued, and men went to the scene of the find in four sorts of conveyances for the purpose of locating locations. It is yet too early to determine definitely the real value of the new district; but the boom is on and Kanosh is a right lively mining camp.

## NEVADA ZINC MINES.

Col. W. A. Root Discovers Large Deposits Near Good Springs.

Colonel W. A. Root, of the Chicago Mining World, says that he was surprised to find that in the southern part of Nevada existed the largest zinc deposits in the United States. They are located within a few miles of Good Springs in Lincoln county, close to the Nevada-California border. In describing them, Colonel Root says:

"The deposits exist in ledges varying from four to 14 feet in thickness, and the values run from 17 to 51 per cent. The Monte Cristo group of veins is owned by Douglas White of Los Angeles, and Gull Horn, Geo. E. Wharton is the general manager. Five men in six weeks exposed over \$20,000 worth of ore along 500 feet of ledge. The ore is of the best quality, and is shipped to Bartlesville, Oklahoma, and to Kansas, have netted over \$12 a ton as raised from the ground. One carload went within 4 per cent of the limit of zinc values in ore."
