Will, dated May 5th, A.D. 1869, recorded in
Mortgage Book B, page 585, of Salt
Lake County Record, conveyed to the under-

plat B, as platted in the Great Salt Lake City

Ward, in Salt Lake City, in the County of Salt Lake,
