New York, March 10.—At the request of the German Orinoco Asphalt company, the cruiser Falke has sailed for Trinidad for Pedernales, Venezuela.

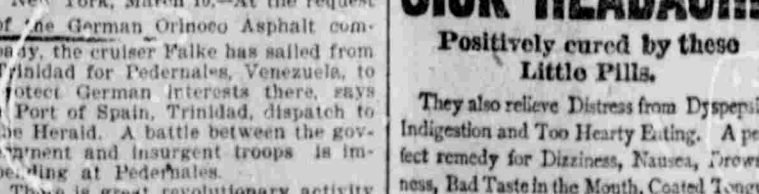
