**MORETON VS COHEN.**

City Recorder J. B. Moreton enters a vigorous denial to the charge that he visited polling places on Wednesday morning, and instructed the "American" party judges to allow anyone to vote who declared himself to be a taxpayer, leaving the voter to take the consequences of any irregularity in his action. The statement that Moreton did this was made by Challenger Henry Cohen, who reported it to Chairman Harry S. Joseph of the anti-bond executive committee yesterday morning.

Recorder Moreton claims that all the instructions he issued were in conformity with section 816 of the election law, and were sent out in a circular, paragraph 16 of which provided that "no person must be allowed to vote whose name does not appear upon the official register. A person whose name appears on said register who shall have paid a property tax in this city in the year preceding this election, is entitled to vote."
