

# TELEGRAPHIC. TRANSVAAL EVENTS.

Review of the Affairs of the Republic, by Joseph Chamberlain.

## ENGLANDERS SOLEMNLY OPPRESSED.

Review of Great Britain and Her Claims—Trial of the Reform Committee.

LONDON, Feb. 7.—The dispatch of the Secretary of State for the colonies, Mr. John Chamberlain, of Feb. 4, to the Governor of Cape Colony, Sir Harry Bulwer, was gazetted this evening. In review of the history of events in the Transvaal since 1860, and points out that the mining interests, the economy of the country, are mainly in the hands of the Englishmen, who are educated by legislation from the rights of manhood, and states that the great majority of adults, and the right of taxation remains a monopoly of the decreasing minority who are engaged in agriculture, while the majority, who are engaged in commerce, are taxed more heavily than the Transvaal and are most severely repressed by the foreign agriculturists impinging and injurious to them.

Mr. Chamberlain emphasizes the self-sacrifice and character of the English population, and reveals that the Unionists' policies were responsible for the English and colonial agriculturists to take up arms.

The Transvaal did not cause itself, as it was understood to be, to become a confederacy prior to independence. When it was, the Committee of Defense, which the Confederates in a political interest at Durban, is reported responsible, Mr. Chamberlain wired a warning to Mr. Bulwer, instructing him to warn Mr. Creel Pheasey, the proconsul of Cape Colony, that the English had already entered the Transvaal.

The document then reviews the subsequent events and proceeds to state the position of Great Britain and its views towards the Transvaal and its independence. It is asserted that the government has recognized the Transvaal's independence internally, but its external relations are subject to the control of Great Britain. There is no power in Great Britain, but the foreign state will determine its rights; but it is necessary to ascertain that the government intends to maintain its interest in the interior. Internally Great Britain is justified, and the stability of the Transvaal, to render friendly counsels respecting the newcomers, mainly British subjects."

The dispatch then deals at length with the entry of the English, and states Mr. Chamberlain's belief that a difficulty of neutralization and the chance to be lost by grading the franchise after five years' residence, or the removal of the obnoxious names of the English, and that the English would still derive the name of British subject. Chamberlain also suggests the consideration of other grievances, taxation, education and manufacture, and especially the treatment of Chinese.

The document also provides that the English be granted limited autonomy, including control of the two taxation, in the payment to the government of an amount sufficient to cover the expenses of the army, navy, and legislature to be subject to the veto of the president and cabinet.

**ADVICE FROM ASIA.**

CORSAIR Fight for their Queens and Other Rights.

HONG KONG, Feb. 7.—The steamer Grecian from Hong Kong and Macao today brought the following advice:

"The many changes introduced in quick succession in Corea, the recent adoption of the western method of governing has attracted much attention. The king recently issued an edict forbidding the practice of the queue, and the example of having his own hair cut, the prime royal following suit. The physicians created nostrum in both official and private circles. The minister of education resigned, and retired to the mountains, where he was received with open arms by the people. The king, however, was so anxious against the innovation that he abdicated his throne. This monarch was exiled, and at such of the following days the capital constables are prepared to arrest the coming of the country people and compel them to submit to the barbers, who are in wait for their victims. In the rural districts the Coreans have broken out into armed rebellion at the proclamation. Many local governors have resigned their posts owing to their unwillingness to submit to the new system. One hundred people have fled to the mountains, and as many more are under arms preparing to attack the Corean troops.

Excuse for Murder.

CANON CITY, Colo., Feb. 7.—James Rauhut, the slayer of the entire school board of Jefferson district, Park county, was hanged at the penitentiary yesterday.

The crime for which Benjamin Rauhut suffered death was one of the most startling in the history of Colorado. Prompted by a desire for revenge for what he considered grievous wrongs, he had sought to assassinate the school board at Jefferson, Park county, and had shot three members of the school board, Samuel Taylor, Lincoln McCurdy and George D. Wyant. The cause of the trouble was the circulation of reports of alleged graft among the teachers. Rauhut had his mother's daughter, a girl of 15. These stories Rauhut attributed to McCurdy. He had also a fancied grievance against the other members of the board over the location of the school house.

"No," was the reply.

SAFETY LAKES KILLED.

E. O. MAXFIELD Shot by Charles H. Smith at Victor, Cal.

SAFETY LAKES, Feb. 7.—A special to the "Republican" from Victor, Calif., O. Maxfield was shot and killed at 115 the afternoon by Charles Holman, a prospector, a person unproven. Maxfield was walking in the hills above the town, and drawing a pistol, shot the gun into the back of his victim. Holman died almost instantly. Holman was a man of good birth and was well liked, and there was strong talk of lynching his slayer. Maxfield came here from Salt Lake about two years ago. His parents live at Spring City, Utah.

### CAMPUS IN MADRID.

Administration by the Web Assistant of the University General.

SOCIEDAD DE LOS ESTUDIANTES. The student body of Madrid says:

This city was the scene of a administration that would have required but very little to have turned it into a serious riot.

As told us, Tuesday last, a number of students, mostly from Madrid, who were driving to his residence from the railway station on his return from Cuba. A number were arrested and one of them broke away from the gunners who had him in his custody and escaped. The gunners followed him and fired twice at him and killed him. The shooting was fully condoned by the republicans.
