Arrive at Hiko Friday by 8 p.m.;
Leave Hiko Monday at 8 a.m.;
Arrive at Beaver Thursday by 8 p.m.;
Proposals for twice and also for three-times-a-week service invited.

Proposals must be to carry the mail with "celerity, certainty, and security," using the terms of the law, and they must be guaranteed by two responsible persons, certified to as such by a postmaster or judge of the court of record.
