Shall be liable, for such offeue to a fine in any sum not exceeding ninety-nine dollars, or to imprison ment for any term not exceeding one hundred days; or to both such fine and imprisonment.

SEC. 2 .- It shall be lawful, on the trial of any person charged with either of the offences named in the preceding section, for the prosection to introduce in support of such charge, testimony of the gene character and reputation of person or place, 'touching the fence or charge set forth in th complaint, and the defendant ma likewise resort to testimony of ike nature for the purpose of d

proving such charge. SEC. 3.—In prosecutions under the second subdivision of Section one of this ordinance it shall be a suffi cient defense if the defendant shows at the trial that he has dillgently used the power which the law gives him to suppress the improper use of the building or tenement concerning which the charge is made.

SEC. 4.-That Chapter forty-four of the Revised Ordinances of Salt Lake City, passed July 20th, 1875, "Relating to Houses of Ill-dame and Prostitution," be, and the same is hereby repealed; Provided, that all offences heretofore committed in violation of any of the provisions of said Chapter forty-four of the Revised Ordinances of Salt Lake City hereby repealed, may be enquired into, prosecuted and punished the same as if this ordinance had not been passed. Passed Dec. 18th, 1877.

It will be remembered that in August, 1865, a special military commission sat in Wash-ington to try Wirz, charged with destroying the lives of soldiers con-fined in the Andersonville military prison. The crimes of which Wirz was convicted and for which he was afterwards hanged, were less offensive to the code of modern warfare than those imputed to Os-man Pasha. Every day brings to light some new horror at Plevna.
