## LOCAL BRIEFS.

**Mr. Brown Convalescent**—Mrs. James H. Brown is convalescent from a severe attack of grip.

**Lecture on Pure Milk**—Local dairy men will meet at the Kenyon hotel tomorrow evening when Dr. W. R. Tyndale will lecture on pure milk.

**First Presbyterian Pulpit**—While the Rev. Dr. Paden is on his vacation the Rev. R. M. Stevenson president of Westminster college is filling the First Presbyterian pulpit.

**Memorial Exercises Tonight**—The Evergreen Lodge, Fraternal Union of America, will hold memorial services in Odd Fellows hall this evening with Rev. P. A. Simpkins to deliver the address.

**Choir to Give Cantata**—The Junior choir of St. Mary's cathedral will give a cantata, "June Song Time" in the Bungalow theater on the 20 inst. the proceeds to be used to buy music for the cathedral choir.

**New Mower Beds Set Out**—The flower beds on the Tabernacle and Temple grounds have been newly laid out with a wide variety of flowers making an attractive spectacle for the thousands of tourists visiting the grounds.

**Call on State Banks**—Charles S. Thayer, secretary of state, issued a call Saturday upon the banks of the state to make a statement of their financial conditions at the close of business on June 8. This is the second call this year.

**Plan to Improve Work**—At yesterday morning's meeting of the Cement Workers in Labor hall 17 new members were enrolled. It was proposed to establish a system of examinations to insure thorough work and to establish such rules as will eliminate irresponsible contractors.
