Editor Deseret News:

We have resolved to forward you the following information about the funeral of the late President Wilhelm.

Yesterday, about noon, the Saints and other mourning friends commenced gathering at the cemetery on purpose to pay their last respects to the remains of a much-loved friend. We had the use of a very nice and convenient hall. The coffin, with the earthly remains of our beloved brother was placed on a stand in the upper end, and was literally covered all over with flowery wreaths of a choice quality, and even the stand, which was draped in black, was richly decorated with beautiful wreaths. On the head of the coffin was two palm leaves, tied together with a blue and a yellow silk ribbon, representing the national flag of Sweden, and bending together with their points, the palm leaves encircled the following inscription: "From mourning friends in Stockholm." Right there was another wreath with: "Farewell, from his assistants at the office," and "Those that knew you best loved you the most." On the sides were seen among many others the following inscriptions: "Farewell to Brother Wilhelm," from the Relief Society in Aarhus; "Farewell from the sisters," and "Farewell from the young brethren," and on the foot end, "Last farewell from the choir." At 1 o'clock the services were taken up, under the direction of Elder Andrew Jensen. Sixteen of the Elders from Zion were present on the occasion. They were stationed near the head of the coffin to the right, and likewise the choir to the left. The choir then sang a hymn which was purposely composed. Elder Hans Funk then made a prayer; after which, short and pointed remarks were made by five of the Elders, and a hymn was sung by the choir. After this, procession was formed and walked out to the grave yard as follows: The six presidents of conferences who were there, acted in the capacity of carriers; their names are: H. Funk, of the Copenhagen Conference; L. M. Olson, Stockholm; S. Christensen, Aalborg; O. N. Stohl, Gothenborg; C. Jensen, Aarhus, and N. B. Adler, of Malmo. Next after the head of the coffin walked Elder Andrew Jensen and Brother Hugo Peterson; next came the rest of the brethren from Zion; after them the members of the choir, and a great many of the Saints and strangers, numbering nearly 300 persons, who all walked four and four together, and were dressed in mourning. The grave was about 300 yards from the above mentioned hall. Soon after arriving at the grave, the coffin was let down by ropes, and the choir sang another hymn, and Elder H. J. Christensen gave thanks and dedicated the grave for the safe keeping of the earthly remains of that faithful man of God, praying that his dust might rest in peace. Thus everything went off in good style and peaceably. The officials treated us with due respect and liberality, and all present seemed to participate in the solemnity of the occasion. Surely it was a day never to be forgotten by us.

A meeting was held in the evening, when several of the brethren spoke words of comfort and good counsel to Saints and strangers assembled. And, now, may his dust be protected until the morning of the resurrection of the just.

Desires were expressed by some to have a monument erected at the grave, and we concluded to consult President Carrington about it.

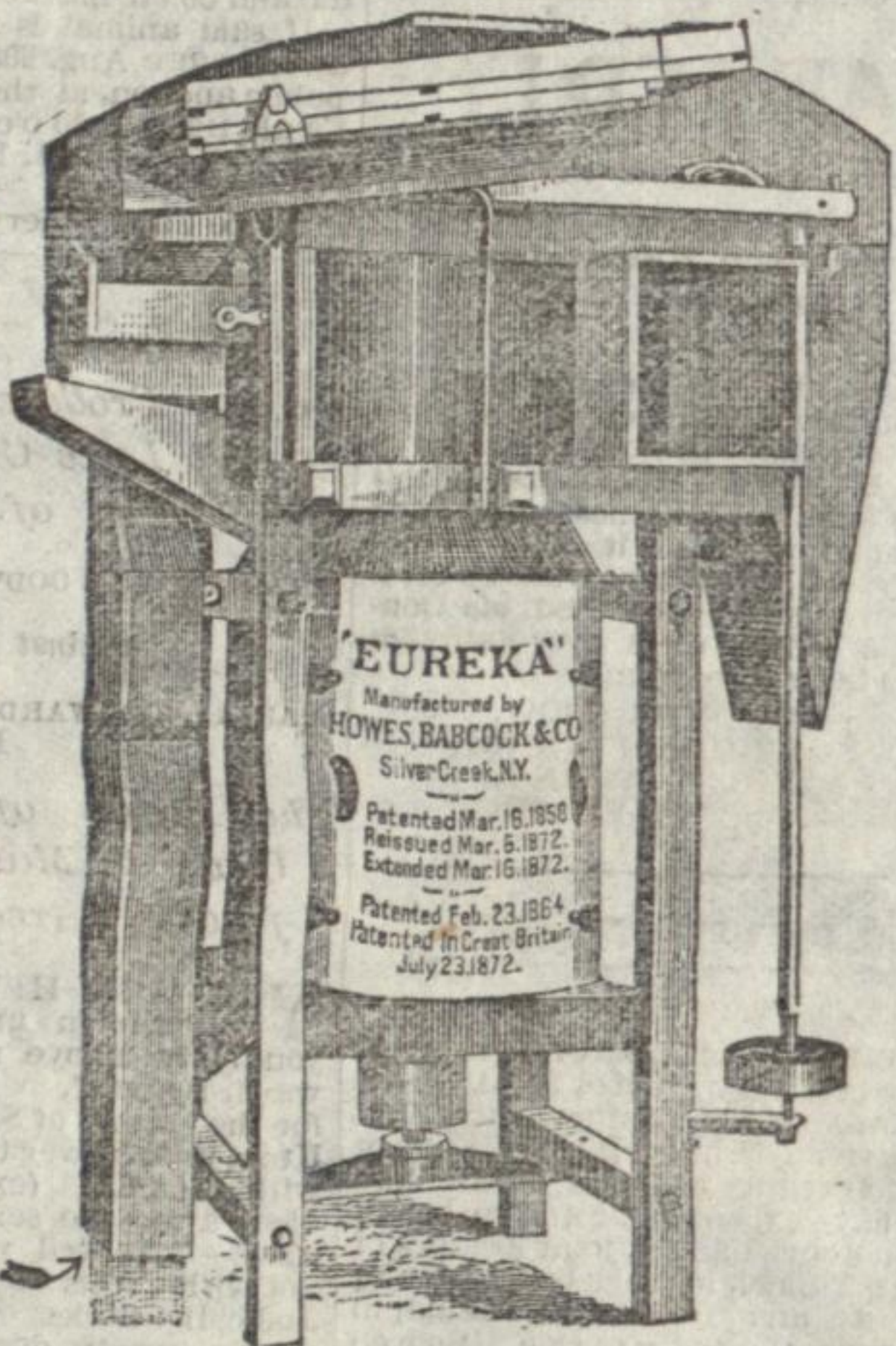
