Pursuant to public advertisement in the "Deseret News," the members of this society met in the Social proved, January 17, 1856," is hereby repealed. Hall at 2 p.m.

Mayor A. O. Smoot was called to the chair by a unanimous vote, and R. L. Campbell was requested to act as Secretary.

The chairman stated that as the business of the meeting was the election of a President and Board of Directors for the year 1859, he would leave the meeting open to the members, that they might nominate such persons Reorganizing Carson and Green River counties, and atas in their estimation were qualified to discharge the onerous and responsible duties which would devolve upon the Board; he said, he should not attempt at this time to expatiate on the beneficial results produced already in this Territory of the society-and the large and increasing field of usefulness which lies before them, but should give way for the introduction of the business.

It was motioned by Dr. Sam'l L. Spragpe that Edward Hunter, Esq., be the President of the Board of Directors of the D. A. & M. Society for the year 1859, seconded by Mr. L. S. Hemmenway, and carried unanimously.

Dr. Levi Richards, motioned that Messrs. Wilford Woodruff, Charles H. Oliphant, W. C. Staines, Seth M. Blair, Lorenzo D. Young and John R. Winder be the Board of Directors of said society for 1859, seconded by M. W. G. Mills and carried unanimously.

In consequence of the condition of the room &c., it was deemed advisable to adjourn until Monday at 6. p.m. R. L. CAMPBRLL, Secretary.

taching St. Mary and Humboldt counties.

SEC. 1 .- Be it enacted by the Governor and Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Utah, that the acts attaching Carson and Green River counties to Great Salt Lake county, are hereby repealed, and the former organizations of said counties revived; and that the records, papers, books, blanks and seals of the Probate and County Courts of said counties, shall be delivered to the respective Probate Judges of said counties.

SEC. 2 .- And be it further enacted, that St. Mary and Humboldt counties are hereby attached to Carson county, for election, revenue and fudicial purposes: and that Genoa is hereby made the county seat of Carson county; and Fort Bridger, that of Green River county.

SEC. 3 .- All laws and parts of laws conflicting with this act are hereby repealed.
