The same may have been true of other railroad towns in the county,

It is cortain that there are more

It is cortain that there are more ranchinen in Laramie county now than there were five years ago, and it is equally as certain that there are more bona fide residents in Cheyenne, al-though there is a smaller force of men in the railroad shops now than five years ago. The increased number of tenements, and the fact that practically all are occupied, shows that Cheyenne has grown, although the census figures, and a comparison with the returns of 1900 show that Cheyenne and the coun-ty have retrograded. Cheyenne now has a permanent population, whereas there a permanent population, whereas there were thousands of graders coming and going daily in 1900.

SHOWING IN UINTA.

Evanston, Wyo., July 24.—The late census gives Ulinta county a population of 14,492, an increase of over 2,000 since the government census was taken in 1900. Of the present population, 8,028 are males and 6,210 are females. Forty-five are black, 44 are Chinese and 165 are Japs.
