## ANOTHER SHOCKING BEAR STORY

Annual Report of the Governor of New Mexico—Faded Family record in Wyoming.

The trial of the Chinese has opened. It will end on Friday before Monday at noon next week.

Henry Lanchett, a prominent member of our city council, was recently wounded by a shotgun bullet. There is doubt as to the source of the shot.

Very High, a well known Chinese laundryman, has lost his life on his way to China. He died while on board a steamer bound for Hong Kong.

United States Attorney Wood, of Denver, Colorado, started yesterday for San Francisco. During the week following he will represent the government in the trial of the apprehended members of the Chinese gang mentioned in the last issue.

Arrests of representatives of the Chinese laundrymen are now being made every day at Pueblo. The officers of the company have now the waters of Colorado back to the head of Indian Canyon, making it necessary to close the laundry.

A number of sites have been purchased by the Chinese laundrymen in New Mexico. The principal site is a hill seventy-five feet high, 400 feet long and 100 feet wide. This hill is composed entirely of sand and gravel. The Chinese have dug out hundreds of tons in sight, so that the site occurs in extensive patches in the surrounding hills.

The Chinese have been compelled to purchase and traverse by porphyry dykes, the leading mine, situated near to the laundry.

Hospital Prince, the governor of the territory of New Mexico, has issued a report to the secretary of the interior highly commending the action of Congress in the recent legislation on the subject of mining claims, but says that the law as to small mining claims and should be speedily amended. The territorial legislature has passed a bill to amend the law, which is slightly different from the one previous. During the year the last act of the public lands have been adopted. Of this number 100,000 have been taken up by miners, 100,000 by homesteaders, and 20,000 desert land entries. There are now open to public sale in the Santa Fe district, 100,000 acres of land. The great majority is being used in irrigation, and several large companies have been incorporated during the year.
