BRYAN'S COMMENT ON THE MESSAGE

Gives President Credit for Original Idea About Campaign Contributions.

APPROVES THE POSTAL BANKS

Losening Up of Hourded Money Will Do More to Relieve Stringency Than Anything Else.

Pitisburg, Dec. 4.-Windam J. Bryan. n route to his home in Lincoln, Neb., arrived here today from Washington and met his wife and daughter, who are bound for New York, whence they vill sail for Europe Saturday.

Mr. Bryan commented on several of the issues treated in President Roosevelt's message and credited the president with introducing an original proposition in suggesting the appropriation of campaign funds by the govern-

nent, "I hope," he said, "that it will be en-

"Thops." he said, "that it will be enacted into a law."

Mr. Bryan is strictly in accord with the president concerning postal savings banks and guaranteed banks. Said he:

"The money hearded in hiding places, if it can be drawn into the banks and thus be put into channels of trade, will relieve the stirngency more effectively than anything else. The postal bank will do this to a limited extent, but not completely, for in the plan proposed the depositors will be limited as to cach person, and no checking accounts will be allowed.

"The system of the guaranteed banks contemplates the absolute guarantee by the government of such banks as may voluntarily enter into the system. On entering the system they agree to reimburse the government in proportion to their deposits for any losses incurred by the government in payment of depositors in falled banks. Buring the last 40 years the average loss among national banks has been less than one-sixteenth of 1 per cent of deposits, and, as we have passed through two panles in that time, it is not likely that the average will be greater during the next 40 years.

"To sum it up, the depositors need

"To sum it up, the depositors need security, and this must either be given by the postal savings bank, which will grow until it has absorbed the deposit banking of the country, or it must be furnished through the guarantee of existing banks."

THOUSAND BILLS INTRODUCED IN SENATE.

Washington, Dec. 4.—Nearly a thougand bills were introduced in the senate today, and all of them were referred to committees, where they will be taken up for consideration after the new senators shall be given committee assignments. No other business of importance was transacted. Almost all of these bills were considered in the last Congress, and most of them are private pension bills.

The whole number introduced in the senate of the Fifty-ninth Congress was 8,627, and before the Christmas holidays it is probable that all least half of them will again be introduced and referred to committees.

Among the most important measures introduced today were the following.

By Senator Hansbrough-Repealing the timber and stone act, and providing for the sale of timber on public lands; also a bill giving homestead entrymen the right to be absent from their homesteads during four winter months.

By Senator LaFollette-Requiring that railroad rates shall be fixed so as only to yield a fair return on the valuation of a road's property.

By Senator Nelson-Extending the free delivery service to all towns having a postal revenue of \$5.000.

A short bill which may take the place of a regular ship subsidy bill this assion was introduced by Senator Gallinger, it provides for an increase of the mail-carrying rate for 16-knot ships plying on the Pacific and the South Atlantic to an amount not exceeding the rate paid to first class vessels.
