

Railroad. So long as the speed is about thirty-seven miles an hour the illumination is good, steady and efficient, but whenever it falls to seventeen miles the light is not satisfactory, notwithstanding the connection of accumulators with the lamps. It would seem, however, that what measureable degree of failure there may be when the train climbs up the steep slopes of the Semmering, between the stations of Gloggnitz and Murzzuschlag, is Simply a matter of easily remedied detail.

A shooting match in a Texas theatre is a business affair. It takes no account of the spectators, of course, and the spectators make up their minds on the firing of the first shot that the safest place is on the outside. A couple of Texas knights of the revolver have just succeeded in emptying a theatre at San Antonio on the shortest possible notice, the audience going through the wladows. The two shootists then made subjects for Coroners' inquests of each other without loss of time. Generally one of the marks-men is spared to shot somebody else.

In a suit for damages sustained in a bridge, it is not essential that the public officers having charge thereof notice of the defect, but if such defect has existed for such a length of time that they ought to have taken notice of it the law will charge them with notice. So held by the Supreme Court of Indiana in the case of the Commissioners of Porter County vs. Dombke, decided March Sth. The court added that the question, what is such a length of time as will charge public officers with notice of a defect in a bridge or highway, must in a great measure depend on the circumstances of each particular case,
