

ADJACENT CITIES PROVO.

Compromise Verdict.—Damage Suit.—An Incurable Boy.—Sunday Services at the Asylum.

Provo, May 18.—The jury in the case of the Provo Coop vs. Thomas Harding, after being out the major part of the day, returned a compromise verdict yesterday afternoon for plaintiff, of \$250.00. Of this sum, a deduction of \$20.70 must be made for wages due Harding.

The case for trial yesterday before Judge Smith was that of W. H. Winn, setting as damages for several parties, vs. the Rio Grande Western Railway company. This is a suit to recover \$250 for eleven horses and cattle killed by the railroad. The case was not completed.

Otto Danielson, a boy of eleven years, from Mayfield, Bangor county, on the application of his father, Danielson, was committed to the Reformatory school. The father represented that the boy was centrally beyond his control, and would do anything from an egg to a horse.

Hans Anderson, a gray-haired man of 70, and Frank Benson, a youth of 20, became engaged in a controversy yesterday, over irrigation water, which ended in a not particularly harmful physical encounter. The old gentleman promptly swore out a charge of assault and battery against Benson before Justice Westwood, and Frank preferred the same charge against Anderson before Justice Alexander.

Short Sunday services were instituted at the Inman Asylum on Sunday last. Dr. Pike reported that many of the patients apparently enjoyed the services. It was a change in the monotonous routine of asylum existence.
