A NARROW ESCAPE.

Passengers on a Union Pacific Train subjected to a severe shaking up last night.

A DANGEROUS NEGRO.

He Gashes the Throat of a White Man at Ogden—Lured Like a Lynching.

There was a serious cutting scrapal Ogden yesterday afternoon, and it is not the fault of A. L. Woods, a colored porter, on the dinner "Golden Gate" that John Doyle is not at this time dead as a door nail.

It came about in this way: Doyle is well known to railroad men in this section of country, having for many years served Western railroads as numerous capacities from engineer to cookhouse. Yesterday morning he arrived in Ogden and soon went up to the "Golden Gate" with Woods. The two men engaged in cards during most of the day in one of the wine rooms of the city. At noon Woods, who had come into town more or less to the winter of several days. A few minutes after three o'clock they ended their play and entered the barroom. Doyle then took to his coat and Woods stepped toward him, saying: "What you want?"
