CAPERS OF A FRACTIONAL COW.

PETER RAFFERTY UNDER ARREST

Robbed a Sleeping Toper in 25th Street Saloon—Cut-off Laborers Sued for Supplies—News Brief.

Peter Rafferty was arrested last evening by Officer Clarence Forbes, for robbing one James Sullivan, who, with a companion named John Martin had come to Ogden and was spending his money about the Twenty-fifth street saloons. Sullivan drank a little too much and went into the rear of the Silver King saloon, where he laid down and went to sleep. While sleeping Rafferty came into the saloon, and finding Sullivan asleep took from his pockets \$7.00. Martin saw Rafferty going through his companion's pockets and notified the police, who immediately started in search of the robber, having a good description of him from Martin. Rafferty was located on lower Twenty-fifth street and placed under arrest. A portion of the money found in his pockets it is supposed came from Sullivan's pockets. Sullivan and Martin were each placed under bond to appear again in court. The bond was required as the men are strangers in the city, and it was feared they might not appear when the case is called.

CAPERS OF A PRACTIOUS COW.
