CO-OPERATION IN ENGLAND.

WE continue our notice of the Leeds Industrial Co-operative Soclety.

Each member may propose, by filling a printed form, one director. The directors are chosen from nomination lists, made from the above forms by the society. General business meeting society are held quarterly.

Portions of the profits may be granted, by the directors to the committee appointed by them, for the advocacy and exten principles of co-operation.

The President, or three directors or a hundred members may convene a special meeting.

All questions are decided by vote the majority binding the minority subject to the society's rules and the laws relating to such societies. Thirty members present within half an hour from the time specified may hold meetings. ' There are also local com
