CITY COUNCIL.

Power Square re-granted to the U. S. Dept. of the Treasury.

Power Square re-granted to the U. S. Dept. of the Treasury. The grant is now made permanent, and the new conditions by which the site is to be used are to be observed. The city will have the right to inspect the construction to which certain parts of the structure are to be dedicated, and extend the time to January 1, 1898. The only negative vote against the proposition was cast by Councilman King, for the reason, he stated, that he did not believe that the government legally took the place of a piece of property to a private owner.

WILL INVESTIGATE FRIDAY.
