LOCAL BRIEFS.

Engineers to Banquet—The first annual banquet of the Society of Engineers will be held on the evening of the 21st inst.

Services Tomorrow—Services in St. Patrick's Catholic church will be resumed tomorrow, after a discontinuance of some weeks.

Fell Twenty Feet—A laborer named Matthews employed at the Garfield copper plant fell 20 feet down an elevator shaft, sustaining serious bruises. He was brought to St. Mark's hospital yesterday, and will recover.

First Meeting of "C" Club—The first meeting of the "C" Club of the State University will be held this evening, in the assembly room at the Museum building. Only degree graduates are eligible.

One Faithful Member—The regular meeting of the board of public works was not held last night owing to the fact that only one member appeared on the scene. The next regular meeting will be held on June 20.

Salt Lake's Standing—In Bradstreet's bank clearings statement for the week ending June 6, Salt Lake stands twenty-ninth in the list of cities, with clearings at \$6,346,000, an increase over the figures of the previous week of \$61 per cent. In New York City, the clearings run up to nearly \$2,000,000,000.
