People of Panama Assemble and Declare Themselves for the Republic of Panama.

GOVERNMENT NOT ALARMED.

U. S. Navy Department Advised of Revolution and Sends Several Warships.

Panama, Colombia, Nov. 2.—The independence of the isthmus was proclaimed today. A large and enthusiastic crowd of all political parties assembled and marched to the headquarters of the government troops where Gen. Tovar and Gen. Amaya, who arrived this morning were imprisoned in the name of the republic of Panama.

County Attorney Mecum of Douglas Returns from Beaver Dams With Detailed Account.

WARREN SAYS, LOOKS SQUALLY

Indians Engaged Were Sioux from Pine Ridge and Were Traveling on Peragit.

Douglas, Wyo., Nov. 3.—County Attorney Mecum has returned here from the Beaver dams on Lightning creek, with full particulars of the recent trouble with the Indians.

Five Indians, including the notorious Eagle Feather, were killed, and five badly wounded of whom three are not expected to live.

Senator Warren's report of the fight at the Beaver dams is detailed in his letter to the state department.
