

A FEARFUL SIGHT.

A Whole Cargo of Dynamite Explodes on Shipboard.

THE PEOPLE PANIC STRIKES.

Great Loss of Life and Property: The Governor of the Province Annals the Disaster.

MATHEW, Nov. 3.—From Hong Kong, a telegram has been received, the capital of the province of that name, where a frightful display of dynamite, the largest ever exploded in the world, has just taken place.
