license issued for one kind of liquo: license entitle the licensee to carry on any business thereunder requiring an-other kind of liquor license; that is, a separate license shall be obtained to carry on each kind of business as defined in this chapter.

Sec. 15-Manufacturer's license resee, 19--Manufacturers incense required for bettling or casking liquors not manufactured in Salt Lake county. Any person desiring to engage in the business of bettling or casking any intoxicating liquors not manufactured in Salt Lake county shall be deemed a manufacturer and it shall be unlawful for any person to carry on such busifor any person to carry on such business without first applying for and obtaining a manufacturer's license unless such person holds a manufacturer's agent or wholesale dealer's license.

Sec. 16-Sale of liquor to minors Indians insane or drunkards prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person, whether acting for himself or as agent, whether acting for himself or as agent, servant or employe of any other person, to give, sell, furnish or deliver, or otherwise dispose of and intoxicating liquor to any Indian or to any person under the age of 21 years or to any person known to the community as an habitual drunkard, or to any insanc or idiotic person, whether said Indian or minor or insane or idiotic person shall buy or receive the said liquor for his own use or consumption, or in his own use or consumption, or in whole or in part for the use or con-sumption of any other person or per-

Sec. 17-Minors, Indians, insane or idiotic persons in saloons or billiard halls prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person to send or take, or for any owner, agent, bartender or emany owner, agent, bartender or employe to permit or allow any person under the age of 21 years, or Indian, or insane, or idiotic person to go to or remain at or be in any saloon, wine room or apartment whatsoever where intoxicating drink is sold or dispensed, excepting thus stores and the disjunction. excepting drug stores and the dining rooms of hotels and restaurants, or to permit any such minor to visit, frequent or remain in any billiard or pool

room or hall.

Sec. 18—Unlawful for minors to misrepresent age. It shall be unlawful

for any person under the age of 21 years to enter or remain in any salcon or other place where intoxicating liquors are sold or dispensed, except drug stores, hotels and restaurants, or to misrepresent his age, and state himself to be over the age of 21 years, in order to gain admission to any salcon or other place, where intoxicating or other place where intoxicating liquor is sold or dispensed, or to se-cure the sale to him of any malt, spir-ituous, vinous or other intoxicating

liquor.

Sec. 19—Females prohibited from being in saloons or wine rooms between the hours of 7 p. m. and 7 a. m. It shall be unlawful for any person keeping any saloon to have or keep in connection with or as a part of his place of business, any enclosed wine room, lunch room or booth into which any female person shall be allowed to enter from the outside, or from such ter from the outside, or from such saloon, and there be supplied with any kind of liquor whatsoever; it shall likewise be unlawful for any person, be he owner, agent, bartender or employe of any saloon, to permit any female person to be or remain in such saloon between the hours of 7 o'clock in the afternoon and 7 o'clock in the forenoon; or to employ any female in any such saloon at any time. saloon at any time.

Sec. 29—Dancing, drunkenness and disorderly conduct in saloons prohib-ited. It shall be unlawful for any person or any agent, manager, or bar-tender, or employe of any person en-gaged in the business of selling intoxicating liquors at retail, to permit lødg-ing in the night time, dancing, drun-kenness or sleeping, or to permit any disorderly conduct in his saloon or

place of business. Sec. 21—Sale or disposal of liquor on Sunday. Evidence. It shall be un-lawful for any person, firm or corpora-tion, or any manager, agent, bartender, servant or employe of any person, firm, or corporation to sell, give away, serve or otherwise dispose of any spirituous, vinous, malt, beer or any intoxicating drink, at any time on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday, except he be a druggist, and then only for medical purposes upon the pre-scription of a regularly licensed phy-

All saloons and bars where any spirit-uous, vinous or malt liquors, beer or any intoxicating liquor is sold, given away or otherwise disposed of, or kept for sale, or to serve, either at wholesale or retail, shall be closed on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday. It shall be prima facie evidence of the violation of this section if any person is seen going in, coming out of or with-in said place on said day. Sec. 22—Physicians prohibited from

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

Sec. 23-Interior of saloons to be open to inspection from the exterior on Sun-All blinds, curtains and screens shall be withdrawn from the doors and windows of all saloons, bars, wine rooms and other places where intoxicating liquors are sold, and all interior doors, screens, blinds and curtains shall be so opened that and unobstructed be had from the sidewalk or exterior of all such saloons, bars, wine rooms or other places where intoxicating liqnors are sold, during all of the time on the first day of the week, com-monly called Sunday. And it shall be unlawful for any person licensed to sell intoxicating liquors at such salcon, bar, wine room or other place, or the manager or other person having tem-porary or permanent charge thereof, to fall to comply with the provisions of

this section. ation of the provisions of this chap Any person licensed under the place of business either or any of the offenses stated in this chapter shall be committed, or who himself shall be found guilty of either or any of said ofnses, shall thereby forfeit his license, due notice as prescribed by law, be re-

oked by the city council.

Sec. 25—License not to be re-issued to any person convicted of any violation of this chapter, or to same place. Any person whose license to sell intoxicating liquors has been revoked by the city council for any cause, shall thereafter be ineligible to receive any license to sell intoxicating liquors in Salt Loke City, and no license shall be granted to be used at the place where said repoked license was used, for six months. voked license was used, for six months after such revocation. Sec. 26—Not more than three licenses

to be issued to any person to sell in-toxicating liquors. Not more than three licenses to sell intoxicating liquors in Salt Lake City shall be issued at any one time to the same person, firm or corporation, and no license to sell in-toxicating liquors shall be issued to any

corporation, and no license to sell intoxicating liquors shall be issued to any
firm or corporation, any members or
stockholders of which combined, hold
a total of three such licenses.

Sec. 27—Unlawful to sell liquor on
election day. It shall be unlawful for
any person, either licensed or unlicensed, to sell, give away or in any
manner dispose of, directly or indirectly, any spirituous, vinous, malt or manner dispose of, directly or indi-rectly, any spirituous, vinous, malt or other intoxicating liquor on the part of any day set apart or to be set apart for a general or special election for any state, county or municipal officers, ex-cept members of the board of cduca-tion, except for medical purposes upon

tion, except for medical purposes upon the prescription of a physician as her-inbefore provided.

Sec. 28—Mayor to issue proclamation discretion. The mayor, whenever in his judgment, the peace, good order and safety of the inhabitants of the city shall require it, and on all legal holidays, may, by proclamation, forbid the sale or other disposition of any and all intoxicating liquors for any stated

sale or other disposition of any and an intoxicating liquors for any stated period of time, not exceeding in all 24 consecutive hours.

Sec. 29—Licensees accepting licenses accept the provisions of this chapter. Any licensee receiving a license under the provisions of this chapter shall be deemed to have accepted the same with the provisions of this enapter shall be deemed to have accepted the same with all the duties, obligations, liabilities, restrictions and ilmitations herein provided for, imposed as part and parcel of said license without other or further notice, and without each or any of such provisions being specifically incorporated in the license to him granted.
