SALT LAKE CITY is essentially a city of homes. Its natural advantages are such as to leave it without a competitor in the stretch of sixteen hundred miles between Denver and the Pacific coast. Its growth, during the past year, like that for several years prior has been steadily forward, and at a rate that borders closely on, and in fact has been, rapidity. While there have been substantial improvements in the business districts building construction has, for the period indicated, been mainly directed to the erection of new homes. The number, as will be seen from the following page of official permits taken from the records of the city building inspector, is very large, and a brief glance at them confirms the statement just made that residence building has been made a specialty.

BUILDING INSPECTOR'S VIEWS.

Commenting on the building record for the past year, Inspector F. M. Ulmer said in the "News": "The showing for 1900 has in every way been most satisfactory. The style of building, too, has been of that character which marks unmistakably the progress we are making. A feature that seems to have been constantly in mind is the disposition to equip residences with modern appointments. For instance, take the smallest homes erected during the year and in the great majority of cases you will find that baths and electric lights have been provided for. Another evidence of good judgment in building is that brick has largely predominated over frame. The fact is experience has proved brick to be cheaper in the long run than the wooden buildings."

"During the first eleven months of the year permits have been taken out to do more than a million dollars worth of work. There has been little if any building that has not been reported to this office—I know of none at least that has been so greatly insignificant. But there is one thing I will mention and that is that the permits taken out do not represent the amount of money actually expended in building operations. The fact is accounted for in this way: Permission to build is granted by the city at so much per thousand dollars, and in order to cut down the cost of the permit, applicants have been generally unscrupulous in their contemplated improvements, not infrequently affirming that they propose erecting a modern six room cottage for \$1,000, or \$1,500, when, as a matter of fact, it is really worth at least \$1,000 in advance of those figures. There are two advantages in this: First, the little saving made in securing the permit, and second, the low cost of the building, which is the real advantage."

"How great a figure will this cut in the grand total?" inquired the "News" man.

"That is hard to say but taking the general average 20 per cent will be a very low estimate. That sum can safely be added to the sum total in every precinct, and one would still be under the actual cost."

FUTURE OUTLOOK.

Regarding the outlook for next year from a building standpoint Mr. Ulmer said: "While there is very little in view yet as to what is to be done in the year—that is, in the erection of business blocks—the indications are that we will enjoy a steady and gradual growth with a probable increase over the year now closing. Most of the homes built this year, by a long way, were built by owners for their own occupation, though there have been a good many houses erected for sale and rent by investment companies. I have heard some rumors about Eastern people coming here next year for the purpose of erecting a class of buildings known as French flats. It seems that there is a decided demand for buildings of this line and that they may get some of them. Again I say that the advance will be along the lines of residence erection. The showing this year would have been considerably in advance of what it is but for the great increase in the cost of building material."

THE YEAR'S BIGGEST BUILDINGS.

The biggest buildings under course of construction during the year, are, first and foremost, the Deseret News block, cost (building inspector's figures) \$210,000; the Kearns mansion, which, when completed, will cost not less than \$100,000; the McCune house, known as the "Bungalow," being erected at a cost closely approximated at \$150,000; the Latter-day Saints' college, \$25,000; Houston block, \$12,000; Cunningham & Co.'s warehouse, \$9,000; improvements by the board of education, \$50,000.

WHERE THE BUILDING WAS DONE.

It is not uninteresting to note where the buildings were done. It will be observed that the Second municipal ward far outstrips any of the other wards. Take from it the "News" building, however, and the Fourth will lead it by 37.33. But in the number of houses erected the Second is really in advance of the other four. After the Second and Fourth come the Fifth and First in the order named. The Third contributed comparatively little to the building record of the year.

NEXT YEAR'S LIST.

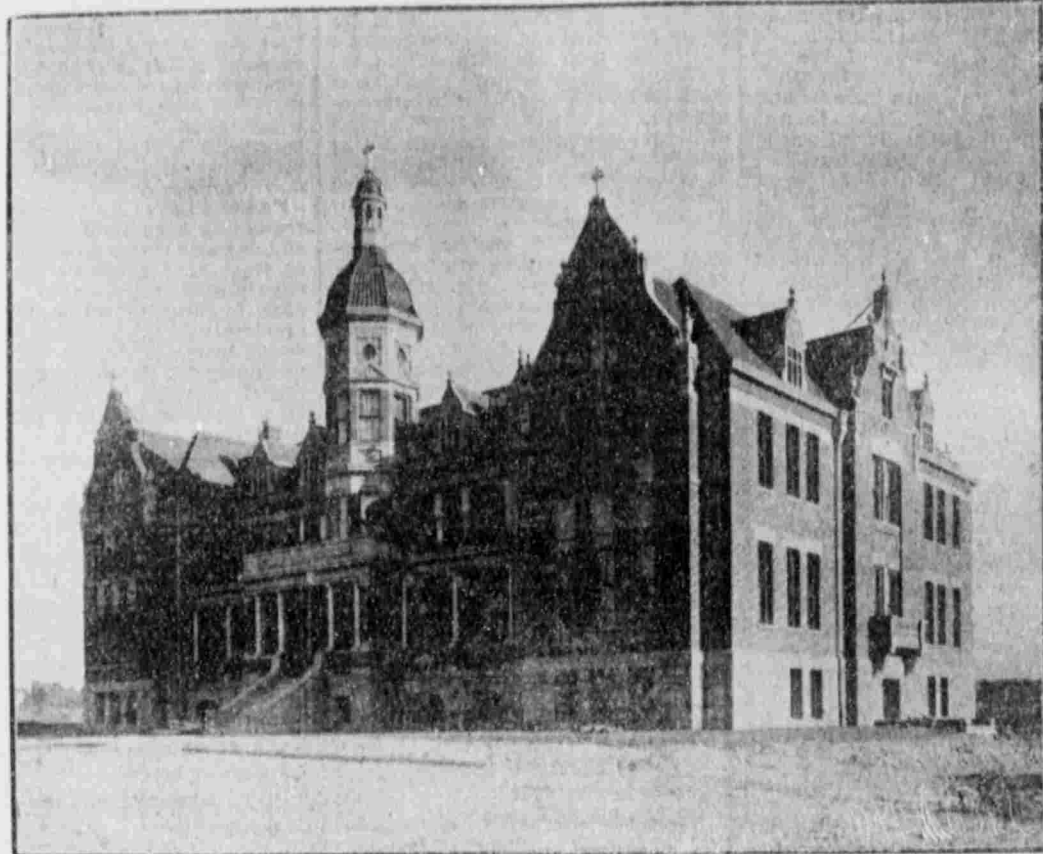
It is very certain that some big building enterprises will be launched next year. SATISFACTORY COMPARISON.

As compared with the record of last year, which reached nearly the million mark, the first eleven months of this year is entirely satisfactory. The fact is that many persons were deterred from building on account of the increase in the price of material and the business is disturbed by a presidential campaign. But probabilities and speculation have been succeeded by known conditions, and notwithstanding that building material is still high, the outlook for building in Salt Lake is of a more rosy hue for
