Valuable Archaeological Discovery by Two Montana Prospectors—Implements of Stone.

On the second of July, as noted in the News dispatches, a couple of mountain prospectors made a discovery which may prove of the greatest importance to the American archeologists in tracing the footprints of the prehistoric races of the West.
