Agricultural Machinery,

Agricultural matchinery, Special Correspondence. London, Jan. 6 - It is expected that the monopoly so long enjoyed by Ameri-can manufacturers of agricultural ma-chinery in England and the British colonies will be seriously attacked shortly. J was informed today that a rivate circular is being issued to farmers by a number of leading British engineering firms pointing but that many of the American patents have new Japased, and American patents have new lapsed, and that users of American machines peed no longer be afraid to introduce Erg-lish-made parts to replace those that have become worn out or otherwise damaged. The two or three English firms that have been in any way able to compete with America in the way of agricultural implements are particular-ly active in the present movement, but the farmers are somewhat afraid of infringing the American patents without serious consideration.
