

SCHOOL BOARD MEETING.

Summer and Quirch Schools Named
Last Night.

HEATING AND VENTILATION.

New Teachers and Instructors Employed—
Never Connection for the
Lincoln Building.

The board of education held their regular weekly meeting last night. Vice President Nason presiding at the chair. There were present Nessman, A. G., Pike, Duke, Pratt, Brigham, Body and Tolson.

THE PRESIDENT.

Milley & Sons Co. offered to install their system of heating and mechanical ventilation in the sixteenth and twenty-seventh schools at per year and specifications submitted by them for the sum of \$2000, and in connection with the same Mr. Hansen, contractor, agrees to build the necessary flues and install the Fuller & Warren system of stoves and connect it to the contract \$250. Committee on sites and buildings.

SCHOOL SITE INVESTIGATORS.

The committee on sites and buildings made the following recommendations:

FIRST.—That authority be granted the committee on sites to purchase land within the city limits.

SECOND.—That authority be granted to the committee on sites to be released from the grounds of the Lowell school to be disposed of in the proper manner on the following conditions: That the committee on sites be given the right to inspect the distribution of the site at the Franklin school grounds. That a sufficient amount be set aside to the benefit of the public in connection with the Franklin school, the Brigham Young school, the Brigham Young school, and others excepted for school purposes. Mr. Hansen, contractor, will furnish a labor force to do the work until the contractors from whom the land is purchased are engaged.

THIRD.—That those be placed in the possession of the Lincoln school committee and the school committee for occupancy at the earliest possible date.

FOURTH.—That the name of the school be changed to the name of the school committee or a name more agreeable to the citizens.

FIFTH.—That the school building be erected in the Ninth ward named the Quirch School.

SIXTH.—That the committee report that they had examined the bill of William Clegg for architectural services to the school committee and recommended its passage.

SEVENTH.—That the school building be erected in the Ninth ward named the Quirch School.

EIGHTH.—That the committee report that they had examined the bill of William Clegg for architectural services to the school committee and recommended its passage.

NINTH.—That the school building be erected in the Ninth ward named the Quirch School.

TENTH.—That the school building be erected in the Ninth ward named the Quirch School.

CONTRACT APPROVED.

The contract and bond of William Ladd & Son, contractors of the building erected in the Third ward were approved.

HEATING AND VENTILATION.

The committee on sites and buildings recommends that the bid of Mr. Hender & Meyer Engineering company for ventilating and heating the Jackson school in the sixteenth ward, submitted July 21st for \$2000, be accepted.

The contractor further offers furnishing an electric motor for \$200, a water meter for \$12 and a steam engine for \$80.

The committee say: We recommend the acceptance of the offer for the heating and ventilating, making a total cost of the entire plant \$2200, and that the president and clerk of the board be authorized to execute a contract thereto.

Adopted on a vote of 7 to 2.

CREMATION SYSTEM.

The committee on sites and buildings recommended that the interior walls of the new building be made of brick and the exterior of wood, provided that the exterior wall is not less than 12 inches thick, and that the interior wall is not less than 6 inches thick, without additional expense. Adopted.

JANITOR APPOINTED.

The committee on janitors and superintendents reported having appointed janitors as follows: John O'Donnell for building on Sixth street, at \$15 a month; Francis Edwards, tenth ward, \$12 a month; George Powers, Twelfth ward, \$10 a month; and T. E. Harris, the high school, \$10 per month; also that they had rented a large room on the second floor of the St. Stephens at \$10 a month, in which the car load of school furniture was received and recommended that the room be used constantly for that purpose. Adopted.

RENTAL.

The committee on janitors and superintendents recommended that J. B. Blomfield, the janitor of the Twelfth school be removed. The committee who recommended the same, Mr. Melchior, is retained in his place at a salary of \$8 a month. Adopted.

NEW TEACHERS.

Superintendent Hollingshead reported the following teachers recently employed: Mrs. A. J. Gunnell, First school, at \$20 per month; Miss Emma Tipton, Fifteenth school, vice Miss Hall, at \$15 per month; Miss Emma Whiting, K. S. school, vice Miss Kuhn, at \$15 per month. The committee on teachers recommended that the engagements be confirmed. Adopted.

SCARLET SPONGE.

The following from Mr. Milneburgh was read:

I desire to report to you in this issue concerning the payment of debts due the Trusteeship school, on account of the extension of school fees in the fall and of the boarding fees in the winter, amounting to

amounts of the above mentioned debts. Trusteeship trustees agreed to pay for such cases, when I hope will nothing be necessary.
