LANSDOWNE COSTUME BY DOUCET.

One of the most attractive models that has reached these shores is a cotume of Nattier blue lansdowne made by Doucet. It contains many new features in both bodice and skirt. To begin with, the skirt is untrimmed, sayfor broad tucks of the fabric itself. This absence of foreign trimming is not. ed on many of the best models of the season. The skirt is cut in five panels each of the panels laid in a five-inch tuck, so that when joined the tucks form a sawtooth border. The skirt is laid in wide forward turning pleats into the hand, the effect being extremely graceful, but one which is possible only the slender hipped woman. The bodice is one of the new draped models. It is arranged over a fully boned lining, the fabric pleated at the shoulder line and draped softly to a high crushed girdle. The V shaped neck and the wide arm holes are outlined with a skeleton of blue velvel, heavy with slik and sourcehembroidery. The high collar and vest are fine lace, and there is a scarf tie of blue chiffon which knots at the bust line and falls in soft lace trimmed ends quite to the walst. The sleeves also are noticeable, in so much us they are the new draped effect. The material is caught up in soft folds to the shoulder top over a straight undersloove of lace. At the elbow the draperies are held together with a velvet bow.
